Storyline

• Maryland returns from a two-game road trip to face defending national champion North Carolina at Comcast Center in a 2 p.m. nationally televised game on Fox Sports Net. The Terrapins are fresh from a hard-fought 71-67 victory at Florida State late Thursday evening. The win over the Seminoles brought the Terps to 15-6 overall and 5-2 in the Atlantic Coast Conference. At exactly the same time the Terrapins and Seminoles were playing, North Carolina dropped a 74-70 game at Virginia Tech, falling to 13-9 overall and 2-5 in the league.

• The Terrapins are now in second place in the league, one game behind Duke. The Terrapins and Blue Devils are the only two teams in the league with two losses. Virginia fell out of a second-place tie with the Terps after losing in overtime at home to Wake Forest yesterday.

• Maryland has won five of its last six games and seven of its last nine. The only losses in that stretch are road losses to Wake Forest, in overtime, and at Clemson. The Terrapins, who are 10-1 at Comcast Center this season, are 7-2 since Jan. 1, 2010.

• Senior forward Landon Milbourne, who had 18 points in the win at Florida State on Thursday, needs just 11 points to become the 49th Terrapin in history to reach 1,000 career points. After averaging 1.0 points per game as a freshman, Milbourne has averaged 14.4 points this season as a senior. He has scored in double figures in 10 of his last 11 games.

• Senior guard Greivis Vasquez needs 104 points to become the 6th player at Maryland to score 2,000 points in his career. He has scored in double figures in 17 straight games.

Scouting the Tar Heels

North Carolina has dropped five of its last six games, with a victory at NC State on Jan. 26 being the only win since Jan. 13... The Tar Heels come into the game with the Terps in an uncharacteristic 10th place in the league standings, prior to Saturday's play...

Sophomore center Ed Davis led the Tar Heels with 15 points and seven rebounds on Thursday against the Hokies... Freshman forward John Henson had 14 points off the bench (5-for-6 from the floor) and freshman forward David Wear added a dozen in a reserve role...

Davis currently leads the Atlantic Coast Conference in blocked shots with 2.7 per game and is second in the league in rebounding at 9.5 boards per game... He trails only Al-Farouq Aminu of Wake Forest on the boards. Davis is shooting better than 58 percent from the floor this season...

Senior forward Deon Thompson is Carolina's leading scorer, averaging 14.4 points per game. Davis is averaging 14.0 points per game...

Sunday's game features a matchup between the top two players in the league in assists, with UNC sophomore Larry Drew II leading the league at 6.2 helpers per game and Maryland's Vasquez just behind at 6.0 assists per game.

Terps Among Decade's Best

Lindy's College Basketball preseason magazine hit the newsstands and has touted the University of Maryland men's basketball program in a number of ways.

The Terrapins are listed ninth among the decade's top programs by the magazine. The listing notes Maryland's national championship in 2002, as well as its 223-111 record during the decade.

Senior point guard Greivis Vasquez is listed on the Terps' All-Decade Team along with Lonny Baxter, Steve Blake, Nik Caner-Medley and Juan Dixon.

The Terps share "The Decade's Top 10 Programs" with Kansas,

North Carolina, Michigan State, Duke, UConn, Florida, UCLA, Texas and Arizona.

Terps Beat the Best in 2008-09

Last season, Maryland was the only team in the nation to beat both North Carolina and Michigan State, the two finalists in the NCAA Championship Game in Detroit... The Terps beat Michigan State, 80-62, in the first round of the Old Spice Classic in Orlando, Fla., on Thanksgiving Night. The Terps added an 88-85 overtime win over then-No. 3 North Carolina on Feb. 21...

According to Stats, LLC, the Terps were the first team to beat both NCAA finalists in the same season since 2003-04 when UNC beat both Connecticut and Georgia Tech... Only three other teams topped both finalists in the same season in the last 12 years... Stanford knocked off Duke and Arizona in 2000-01, while Purdue and Kentucky both defeated the title game participants in 1999-2000 (Michigan State and Florida).

Gary Williams' 21st Season

Recently, ESPN analyst Jay Bilas listed Maryland head coach Gary Williams as one of six coaches nationally who deserved recognition for their progress this season with their teams.

Williams continues to roll up Hall of Fame-style numbers in terms of his 32-year career and the 21 years he's been directing basketball fortunes at his alma mater...

He is the 5th-winningest active head coach in NCAA Division I men's basketball with an overall record of 640-363 (.638)... The 1,000th game in his illustrious career was on Jan. 23 when the Terps played host to NC State...

He ranks 3rd all-time (2nd active) among coaches at ACC schools with 432 victories at Maryland, and also ranks 2nd among active league coaches with 192 ACC victories... Williams is the Terps' all-time winningest coach.

Maryland Among ACC's Best Last Ten Years

Maryland has been one of the top programs in the ACC over the past 10 seasons... At the start of 2009-10:

- With 107 victories since 1999, Maryland is 3rd among all ACC schools in regular-season conference wins.
- Head coach Gary Williams ranks 2nd among active ACC coaches with 172 career wins in league play.
- The Terps captured the 2002 ACC regular-season title & the 2004 ACC Tourney championship.
- Maryland owns the league's best record in games against Duke and North Carolina over the past 10-plus seasons. The Terps are 20-28 in games against Duke and Carolina since the 1998-99 season... No other ACC team has more than 14 wins against the Blue Devils and Tar Heels in that time.

Maryland vs. Ranked Teams Under Gary Williams

Since Gary Williams took over in 1989-90, Maryland has 71 wins over Top 25 teams, including a 77-68 win over #18 Florida State on 1/10/10.

- Williams is the nation's winningest active coach vs. top-ranked teams with seven career victories over a No. 1 opponent (6 at Maryland; 1 at Ohio State).
- Under Williams, Maryland has defeated 19 Top 5 opponents, 33 Top 10 opponents and the No. 1 team 6 times.
- Maryland has 22 wins over Top 10 teams the last 9 years.
- The Terps have defeated at least one Top 10 opponent in 16 of 20 seasons under Williams, including 13 straight.
- Williams has led victories over 1st-, 2nd- or 3rd-ranked teams in 8 of the last 10 seasons.

Milestones, Streaks, Rankings, etc.

- Maryland has hit at least one 3-pointer in 377 consecutive games.
- The Terps are 69-7 in non-conference games in Comcast Center.
- Maryland has won at least 19 games in 13 straight seasons.
- The Terps have made 16 consecutive postseason appearances.
- Maryland's last losing season came in 1992-93, the last season of devastating NCAA sanctions levied against previous staffs at Maryland... Each school in the ACC has had a losing season since the Terps fell below .500 some 15 seasons ago... In fact, 9 of the 11 ACC opponents have suffered through a losing season since the Terps won the NCAA title in 2002... Duke and UNC are the exceptions.
- Landon Milbourne is 11 points away from becoming the 49th player to have 1,000 in his career.
- All five Maryland starters are among leaders in the Atlantic Coast Conference in one or more statistical categories.
- Maryland is shooting considerably better than it did in the 2008-09 season... The Terps are currently posting a .478 clip from the floor... A year ago, the Terrapins shot .424... Those two figures are .380 this year and .333 last year from behind the arc.
- Maryland has held its last five opponents under .400 shooting from the field (.368 at BC, .294 vs. Longwood, .364 vs. NC State, .383 vs. Miami, .319 at Clemson, .377 at FSU)... In those five games, Terp opponents have combined to shoot .348 (131-for-376).
- Greivis Vasquez's next 3-point FG will be his 200th, making him the 3rd player in school history to hit 200 treys (Juan Dixon 239, Mike Jones 203)... Vasquez is 6 3FGA away from tying Dixon for the school record at 615.
- Vasquez is only 9 assists away from recording 700 in his career.
- Maryland has outrebounded its opponents in 7 of its last 10 games and 9 of its last 13.

Tough Schedule Once Again

• Maryland is facing its typically difficult schedule again this season. In this week's ESPN / USA Today coaches' poll, four Terrapin opponents in 2009-10 were ranked among the top 25 (#2 Villanova, #9 Duke, #16 Wisconsin, #19 Georgia Tech)... Three others (Clemson, Florida State and Virginia Tech) received votes in the coaches' poll.

The Venezuelan Sensation

Guard Greivis Vasquez enters his final season poised to become one of Maryland's top players in school history in terms of the breadth of his impact:

- He was voted second team All-Atlantic Coast Conference for the second straight season after his junior year. It was the first time since 2002 a Terrapin has appeared back-to-back on at least the second team (Lonny Baxter, 2000-01 and 2001-02)...

- A year ago, Vasquez led the Terps in minutes (34.6 mpg), FG (210), FGA (522), 3FG (64), 3FGA (198), FT (111), FTA (128), rebounds (5.5 rpg), assists (5.0 apg), steals (1.41 spg) and points (17.5 ppg)... He became the first Terrapin in recorded history to lead the team in points, rebounds and assists in a season... Team leaders date back in the media guide to 1970... He was also the 6th player in ACC history to accomplish that milestone.

- With 1,896 points and 691 assists, Vasquez leads all returning players in the ACC in those two categories.

- Against #3 North Carolina on 2/21/09, Vasquez had one of the strongest games in school history... He became only the third Terrapin to record a triple-double, scoring a career-high 35 points, grabbing 11 rebounds and dishing out 10 assists... It was the first triple-double for the Terps since Derrick Lewis accomplished the feat with points, rebounds and blocks twice in 1987... Vasquez scored Maryland's first 16 points of the game against the Tar Heels and had 8 of the Terps' dozen points in overtime... His basket with 8 seconds left in regulation completed a rally that erased a 9-point deficit in the final 1:39... His 3-pointer with 1:16 left in overtime gave the Terps a lead they would never give up... Vasquez's previous career-high in points was 28.

- AGAINST FAIRFIELD THIS SEASON, VASQUEZ BECAME THE 38TH TERRAPIN TO REACH 500 REBOUNDS FOR HIS CAREER... He is the first Terrapin ever with 500 rebounds and 500 assists.

- Vasquez's 5.6 apg average ranks behind only all-time assists leader and current Portland TrailBlazer Steve Blake, who averaged 7.0 over his career... He is now 2nd in school history with 691, having recently passed Keith Gatlin (649, 1984-86, '88)... Blake finished with 972 from 2000-03.

- In the season-opener against Charleston Southern, Vasquez recorded 13 assists... He fell two shy of the single-game school record he shares with Terrell Stokes... It marked the 10th time in his career he's hit double figures in assists in a game... His 11th came on 12/22 with 11 against Winston-Salem State.

- He currently is on Maryland career lists in points (6th), assists (2nd), steals (10th), FG (10th), FGA (6th), 3FG (3rd), 3FGA (2nd), FT (9th) and FTA (14th).... At the Miami game, Vasquez moved past Lonny Baxter (1999-2002) into 6th on the scoring list... Vasquez is 104 points away from becoming the 6th player in Maryland history to reach 2,000 points... John Lucas is 5th on the scoring list with 2,015 from 1973-76.

- Vasquez has scored in double figures in 100 of his 124 career games (81 percent).

- Vasquez is among ACC statistical leaders in points (4th), FT% (6th), assists (2nd), steals (8th), assist-turnover ratio (7th) and minutes (7th).

- He is averaging 20.1 ppg in his last 17 games (all in double figures) and has raised his scoring average from 7.5 to 17.7 ppg in that stretch.

- He scored 20 points or more in seven straight games between 12/12/09 (Eastern Kentucky) and 1/12/10 (at Wake Forest) and his efforts against Winston-Salem State (12/22) and Florida Atlantic (12/27) earned him ACC PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS FOR 12/28... It was the 5th time he's earned that award in his career.

- Vasquez's streak was the longest by a Terrapin since Walt Williams finished the 1991-92 season with 19 straight 20-point games... Juan Dixon (2/20-3/8/2002) and John Gilchrist (12/5-28/2004) also put together 5-game streaks of 20-point games.

- Vasquez is averaging 20.8 points in his last 13 games, with the first 7 in that stretch being the streak of games with at least 20 points... He's hitting .475 from the floor and .414 from 3-point range in his last 12 games.

- Vasquez is now 2nd in the league in assists with a 6.0 apg mark (Larry Drew II, UNC, 6.2 apg) and is 10th in the nation coming into the weekend... He had 11 vs. Winston-Salem State (12/22), also scoring 27 points en route to his first double-double of the season and the 11th of his career.

- Vasquez has had a pair of 9-assist games (at BC, vs. Miami) recently... He has led or tied for the team lead in assists in 17 of Maryland's 21 games this season.

- Vasquez led the Terps in points (23), rebounds (7) and assists (7) at FSU, marking the first time since Vasquez's triple-double last year vs. UNC that a Terrapin has led the team in those three categories in a game.

More From Milbourne

Landon Milbourne enters his senior season having gained a measure of versatility to his game after moving inside last year... His effort exemplified his leadership role on the team...

- Milbourne joined Vasquez as the only two Terps a year ago to start all 35 games.
- Milbourne was 2nd on the team in rebounding with a 5.3 rpg average last year.
- This season, against Charleston Southern, Milbourne led the Terps in scoring with 16 points, hitting 7 of 10 shots from the field... He also added seven rebounds, two blocks and four steals.
- Against UNH, Milbourne hit 9 of 15 from the floor en route to a career-high 24 points... He ranks 4th in the ACC with a .537 shooting percentage from the floor.
- He has moved into 17th on the career blocked shots list at Maryland, now with 84.
- Milbourne has moved into 2nd on the team in scoring (14.4 ppg) and is 3rd in rebounding (5.4 rpg).
- Milbourne had a string of 9 games with double-figure scoring snapped at Clemson.

Hayes Continues Strong Play

Eric Hayes has been a steady influence throughout his first three years as a Terrapin... He comes into his senior year having played 100 games in his career and, with a 3-pointer late in regulation at Wake Forest, became the 48th Terrapin to reach the 1,000-point plateau:

- His best games of last season came at the end, when he averaged 15.2 ppg in five postseason games... He scored in double figures in 9 of the last 13 games (12.8 ppg) and in each of the last 5 games... His first two 20-point games of his career came at the ACC Tournament, where he scored a career-high 21 (5-for-6 3FG) against NC State and 20 in the semis against Duke... He earned 2nd team All-Tourney.
- His current .877 FT percentage would top the school's career list (Greg Manning, .858 from 1978-81)... Hayes has hit his last 15 free throws in a string dating back to 1/3.
- Hayes is currently 7th on the career list of 3-pointers made with 175 and is 7th in 3-point attempts (440)... He went 4-for-8 against Eastern Kentucky to pass Walt Williams (154 from 1989-92) for 7th on the 3FG list.
- He leads the Terrapins with 43 3-pointers this season... He has a 3-pointer in 19 of the Terps' 21 games this year, missing only in lopsided games at UNC Greensboro and Longwood... His .443 shooting percentage behind the arc is 2nd in the ACC (Sammy Zeglinski, Virginia, .452)... He's also hitting .475 from the floor and has missed only three free throws this year (32-for-35).
- Hayes is continuing his career-long trend of taking care of the ball, now with 69 assists and 29 turnovers (2.38 assist-turnover ratio, 2nd in the ACC, Jon Scheyer, Duke, 3.2)... He had a season-high 9 against Florida Atlantic (12/27) with just 1 turnover... In his last 11 games, he has 40 assists and just 13 turnovers (3.1 ratio).

Mosley Improving

Sophomore guard Sean Mosley has had an outstanding start to the new season. After working hard on the offensive part of his game in the summer, the dedication seems to be paying off:

- The first 20-plus point game of his career came in marquee fashion as he scored 26 against then-3rd-ranked Villanova... Mosley hit 11 of 14 shots from the floor and went 3-for-4 from behind the arc en route to the top scoring performance by a Terrapin to that point in the season.
- Mosley is now 3rd on the team with a 11.7 points per game average, having scored in double figures in 13 games.
- Mosley is 4th on a list of ACC players who have improved their scoring average from last season... Mosley has gone from 5.3 ppg as a freshman to 12.5 currently (+6.4).
- He's hitting .561 from the floor thus far this season, including a perfect 8-for-8 from the floor en route to a team-high 21 points against Longwood.
- Mosley improved his career-high in single-game assists from four to 10 vs. New Hampshire.
- After the first three games, he had 16 assists and no turnovers.
- Mosley is 2nd on the team in rebounding with a 5.7 rpg average... His career-high 13 boards at Wake Forest (6 offensive) were the most by a Maryland player this season at the time.
- Seth Davis of SI.com recently listed Mosley among his breakout sophomores in 2009-10.

Freshman on the Boards

Freshman forward Jordan Williams has made an immediate impact on the glass:

- Williams leads the team and is 8th in the ACC in rebounds with an 8.0 rpg average... He's been particularly strong on the defensive glass with 114 of his 167 boards at the defensive end.
- Williams has led or tied for the team lead in rebounding in 14 of the Terps' 21 games.
- Williams holds eight of the top 10 single-game efforts on the boards this year with six games in double figures... His 13 at Clemson last Sunday tied Sean Mosley for the most by a Terp this year.
- Williams had at least 5 rebounds in each of his first 15 games as a Terrapin and in 20 of 21 contests.

Attendance Continues to Soar

Attendance for Maryland basketball remains consistently strong on a national basis. For the past 10 seasons, the Terps have been ranked in the top 10 nationally in overall attendance, home and away.

Over the last seven years, the Terps have ranked at least 8th nationally in home attendance, which has skyrocketed to 2,127,133 - an average of 17,294 each time the Terps play in the Comcast Center.

- In 2007-08, Maryland ranked 6th in the nation as 341,050 watched 19 Terrapin basketball games, as the Terps played to 100 percent capacity for the second time in six seasons.

- In 2003-04, the Maryland basketball team finished fifth nationally in home attendance average for the second-straight season and records were once again shattered at the Terps' state-of-the-art Comcast Center. The Terrapins and their fans set new records for single-game attendance with 16 full sellouts as the Terps played to 100 percent capacity (17,950).

- In 2002-03, when the Terrapins first moved into the \$125-million, 17,950 seat Comcast Center, they shattered all previous attendance records set in storied Cole Field House.

Terps Rated No. 1 in Fan Support

University of Maryland students were rated best in the nation at supporting their intercollegiate sports teams, according to a 2005 survey by the *Princeton Review*. In its annual ranking list of its Top-20 colleges in a number of categories, the *Review* lists a number of extracurricular activities, including one titled "Students Pack the Stadiums." Maryland topped that list followed by Notre Dame, Florida, Penn State, North Carolina, Georgia, Gonzaga, Arizona, Tennessee and Texas.

Great Guard Play

- Ball-handling has been a strength of the Terrapins this season... Maryland is 2nd in the league in assists (16.1 app), 2nd in turnover margin (+4.0) and 1st in assist-turnover ratio (1.31)... The Terps have had more assists than their opponents in 16 of 21 games this year.

- The Terrapins are also among the national leaders in each of those team categories (21st in assists per game, 20th in assist-turnover ratio and 19th in turnover margin).

- Maryland has had 10 or fewer turnovers in 9 contests this season, including three of the last six.

Working Overtime

Maryland is 47-48 all-time in overtime games... Maryland has played at least one overtime game in 16 of the last 18 seasons, including each of the last 8 years.

- Maryland's 89-74 OT win over Vermont (11/21/08) marked the largest winning margin in an overtime game for the Terps, who outscored the Catamounts 17-2, including the first 17 points of the extra session.

- Maryland is 25-17 in overtime games played at home, including a 6-0 mark at Comcast Center... The most recent OT win came on 2/21/09 against 3rd-ranked North Carolina.

- The Terps are 16-17 in overtime games under Gary Williams.

- Maryland is 0-1 in overtime games this season, having lost at Wake Forest, 85-83, on 1/12/10.

Adept at Long Range

Maryland has proven to be one of the nation's most proficient 3-point shooting teams since the rule was instituted in 1987.

- Maryland has made at least one 3-pointer in 376 consecutive games.

- Maryland has failed to make a 3-pointer just twice in the last 444 games.

- The last game the Terps failed to make a 3-pointer was 1/7/1999 when Maryland went 0-for-7 from 3-point range in a 71-66 win at Virginia.

- Since Gary Williams took over, Maryland has hit a 3-pointer in 659 of 666 games.

- Since the rule was instituted in 1987, Maryland has hit at least one three-pointer in 716 of 725 games.

- Maryland made a school-record 217 treys in 2001-02.

- The Terps' top 3-point shooting percentage was .461 (122-for-290) in 1987-88.

- Maryland set new school records for most 3-pointers in a game (17) and most 3-point attempts (37) in 2006-07 against Missouri-Kansas City.

The Terps vs. No. 1

- Maryland posted an 82-80 victory over No. 1 North Carolina on January 19, 2008.

- The Terps are tied for second place in NCAA history with 10 wins over No. 1-ranked teams.

- Maryland has won four of its last seven meetings against top-ranked teams.

- Maryland has defeated a No. 1-ranked opponent in four of the last eight seasons.

- Two of the Terps' last four wins over a top-ranked team have been against Duke.

- Head coach Gary Williams ranks T1st with Roy Williams among all active Division I coaches with seven career wins over a No. 1 team (6 at Maryland, 1 at Ohio State).

- The Terps have played 24 games vs. No. 1 teams dating back to 1953-54.

- Maryland is 109-25 (.813) all-time at Comcast Center.

- Maryland is 163-30 (.845) at home the last 10-plus seasons (since 1998-99).

- Against Virginia (1/20/09), Maryland became only the 3rd school in ACC history to post 400 league wins.
- The Terps are 410-397 (.508) all-time in ACC games.
- Maryland is 255-146 (.636) in ACC home games.
- Maryland is 149-241 (.382) in ACC away games.
- Under Gary Williams, Maryland is 177-147 (.546) in ACC play.
- Maryland is 108-53 (.671) at home in ACC games under Williams, including a 39-18 (.684) mark at the Comcast Center.
- The Terps have captured three ACC Tournament Championships: 1958, 1984 and 2004.

Commitment To Education

Under Gary Williams, the Maryland basketball program continues to place a high priority on education and the personal growth of its student-athletes. Maryland has graduated eight of its last 10 seniors and all four current seniors are on track to earn their degrees this season.

Jerome Burney has been named the recipient of the LeFrak Scholarship Award. The scholarship represents an endowment established by the Samuel J. and Ethel LeFrak Foundation, and is awarded annually to three Maryland student-athletes who exhibit extraordinary athletic, leadership and scholarship abilities.

Many former Terps continue to work toward their degrees while continuing to pursue professional basketball opportunities. Keith Booth, a four-year starter and 1997 All-American, graduated in 2003 after pursuing a professional basketball career that included winning an NBA Championship in 1998, and is now one of Gary Williams' assistant coaches. Former Terps Calvin McCall, Laron Profit and Terrell Stokes are among the recent men's basketball players to earn degrees from the University of Maryland. Maryland student-athletes all work toward completion of their college degree with the assistance of the Academic Support and Career Development Unit.

Terps Sign Three Players for Fall 2010

Head Coach Gary Williams landed one of his best recruiting classes in recent memory during the early signing period when Ashton Pankey, Mychal Parker, and Terrell Stoglin signed National Letters of Intent to play basketball at Maryland.

The trio has the Terrapins' 2010 recruiting class among the top 20 in the nation, according to a number of national recruiting analysts. Rivals.com currently has Maryland's signing class ranked 15th in the nation, while ESPN.com has ranked the Maryland signing class at No. 19.

"All three players should have an immediate impact on our program," said Williams. "They have the maturity and ability to play at a high level."

All three signees are listed by analysts as outstanding prospects at the high-major level.

Pankey is a 6-foot-9 power forward from Bronx, N.Y., who plays at St. Anthony High School. He was ranked 36th in the nation among power forwards by Scout.com.

Parker is a 6-foot-6 small forward who plays for the Miller School in Crozet, Va. A four-star prospect by Rivals.com, he was ranked 13th nationally among shooting guards by ESPN.com.

Stoglin is a 6-foot-1 point guard from Tucson, Ariz. He averaged 27 points and seven assists a game as a junior at Santa Rita High School and is a two-time player of the year in the Tucson area. He is the 19th-ranked point guard in the nation by ESPN.com.

The threesome is slated to replace the three-player senior class which is on pace to graduate in the spring. Maryland's roster includes seniors Greivis Vasquez, Landon Milbourne and Eric Hayes, who are slated to graduate in the spring.

Booth Named Terps' ACC Legend for 2010

Maryland assistant coach Keith Booth will be one of the players honored this March at the 2010 ACC Tournament Legends Brunch held in Greensboro, N.C.

Booth, who played for the Terrapins from 1994-97, was a third-team All-America selection in 1997 by both the Associated Press and the NABC, helped lead the Terrapins to an 82-44 four-year record and four NCAA Tournament appearances. Booth is still ranked ninth on the Maryland career scoring list with 1,776 points, sixth in rebounds and sixth in steals. He earned first-team All-ACC accolades in 1997 and third-team honors in 1995 and was a second-team All-ACC Tournament pick in 1997. A first-round draft pick by the Chicago Bulls in the 1997 NBA Draft, he played for the Bulls in 1998 when they captured the NBA World Championship. He rejoined Maryland as an assistant for Head Coach Gary Williams for the 2004-05 season.

Former Terps Coach Bud Millikan Dies

Bud Millikan, who coached men's basketball at the University of Maryland from 1950 to 1967, died recently at the age of 89.

Millikan coached for 17 seasons at Maryland and compiled a 243-182 (.572) record. The Terrapins reached the NCAA Elite Eight and won the Atlantic Coast Conference title in the 1957-58 season. That Terrapin team went 22-7 and finished sixth in the nation in the final rankings.

Williams played as a point guard for Millikan's Maryland varsity team from the 1964-65 season through 1966-67. Williams said Millikan's coaching style gave a number of his players the inspiration they needed to become successful coaches in their own right.

"He was my coach for all four years," said Williams, who noted that Millikan also played and learned under legendary Hall of Fame coach Dr. Henry Iba. "I think his strength was he was a very strict fundamentals coach. That was an important part of a number of us becoming head coaches."

Williams noted that players like Billy Jones (UMBC), Joe Harrington (Hofstra, George Mason, Long Beach State, Colorado), Terry Truax (Towson) and Billy Franklin (Bowie HS) were all head-coaching products of Millikan's program.

"To have that many coaches come off one team shows that if you listened, you picked up a lot of good things," said Williams. "He was a tough coach and if you wanted to play, you did things his way. He was a great person."

Millikan, who also was the coach when Billy Jones became the first African-American player to play basketball in the ACC, was inducted to the University of Maryland Athletics Hall of Fame in 1988.

Since returning to the College Park campus in 1989, Gary Williams (Maryland '68) has led his alma mater's basketball program from a period of troubled times to an era of national prominence. With 13 NCAA Tournament berths in the last 16 seasons, seven Sweet Sixteen appearances, a pair of consecutive Final Four showings, and the 2002 National Championship - the first of its kind in Maryland basketball history - Williams and his staff have literally forged what is now more than a decade of dominance in college basketball's most storied and competitive conference.

Now, with 433 victories as Maryland's head coach, Williams stands as the Terrapins all-time winningest head basketball coach. He passed Charles "Lefty" Driesell, who amassed 348 victories in 18 seasons from 1969 to 1986. The Terrapins have averaged 22.6 wins per year since the 1994-95 season.

With 640 career victories in 32 seasons overall, Williams is the 6th-winningest active head coach in NCAA Division I men's basketball. The rise of the Maryland program has run parallel with Williams' ascent among the most notable in the collegiate coaching fraternity. Williams was one of only five coaches to boast a string of 11 consecutive trips to the NCAA Tournament from 1994-2004. He has produced at least 20 wins in 11 of his last 14 seasons, and in a school-record eight straight from 1996-97 to 2003-04. With 17 career 20-win seasons, Williams is tied for 7th among active coaches.

► In June of 2005, Williams received the University of Maryland's highest alumni honor as he, Connie Chung, Renaldo Nehemiah and others were inducted into the University of Maryland's Alumni Hall of Fame. Williams was inducted into the University of Maryland's Sports Hall of Fame in 1999.

► In January of 2005, Williams was named one of *Washingtonian* Magazine's 'Washingtonians of the Year.' He joined others such as Washington D.C. mayor Anthony Williams and Tim Russert of NBC's Meet The Press on the prestigious list.

► In September of 2004, Williams joined Washington Redskins great Darrell Green and Washington Sports and Entertainment Chairman and CEO Abe Pollin as the inaugural inductees into the new Greater Washington Sports Hall of Champions.

► Williams was one of only five coaches in NCAA Division I to have led his team to 11 consecutive NCAA Tournaments, from 1994-2004. The Terrapins' 2009 appearance in the NCAA Tournament marked the 16th consecutive postseason berth for Williams' teams.

► In guiding his 2004 Terrapins to the ACC Tournament title, Williams became the third coach in league history to lead his team to victory over the top three seeds: No. 3 Wake Forest, No. 2 NC State and No. 1 Duke. By overcoming a 21-point first half deficit against the Wolfpack, Williams engineered the greatest comeback in the 52-year history of the ACC Tournament.

► He is one of seven college basketball coaches since 1980 to guide his alma mater to the Final Four and was the first since 1974 to lead his alma mater to a national title.

► A winner of nearly 70 percent of his NCAA Tournament games while at Maryland, he ranks ninth among active coaches in NCAA Tournament winning percentage overall (28-15, .651), and eighth in wins (28).

► With his 500th win at NC State on March 2, 2003, the 1968 Maryland grad became the sixth ACC alumnus in conference history to amass as many as 500 coaching victories.

► With a victory over No. 1 North Carolina in Chapel Hill on Jan. 19, 2008, he is the winningest coach in the nation against top-ranked opponents (7).

► With 433 wins as Maryland's head coach, Williams is only the sixth mentor in Atlantic Coast Conference history to pass the 300-victory milestone.

► With 177 career regular-season ACC victories as Maryland's coach, Williams ranks as the third-winningest ACC coach in terms of conference victories. Only Dean Smith (364, North Carolina) and Mike Krzyzewski (273, Duke) have more ACC conference wins.

► Williams coached the 1,000th game of his 32-year career on 1/23/2010 at home against NC State.

Williams was heralded as the national and Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year during the Terps' 2002 championship run. He is one of just 11 active coaches in America to boast a national title and one of only three in the conference. He has become the third-winningest coach in ACC history after transforming the Maryland program into one of the nation's most formidable, and building a Baltimore-D.C. area following that has consistently resulted in packed arenas. After demolishing attendance records with sellout crowds during the final years of Maryland basketball at Cole Field House, Williams' Terps have finished in the top 10 nationally in each of the last nine seasons. The Terrapins played before 341,050 fans in 2007-08, averaging 100 percent of capacity for the second time in Comcast Center history.

Williams is one of just two 600-win coaches who now engineer the programs at their respective alma maters, joining Jim Boeheim at Syracuse. With Roy Williams of North Carolina, those three also are the only active coaches to direct their alma maters to at least one Final Four appearance.

In 2001, Williams became just the sixth coach since 1980 to direct his alma mater to the Final Four. A year later, he became the first coach since 1974 to guide his alma mater to a national title. Williams is the only active coach to take his alma mater to consecutive Final Four appearances. He is only the eighth mentor ever to guide his alma mater to consecutive Final Fours, and the first since Houston's Guy Lewis in 1982, 1983 and 1984.

A former Terrapin point guard and 1968 graduate, Williams was a starter under coach Bud Millikan during the 1965, 1966 and 1967 seasons. He was the team captain as a senior and still lists one of his most memorable basketball moments as his experience as a spectator at the 1966 national championship game conducted at Maryland's legendary Cole Field House, between Texas Western and Kentucky.

The Terrapins' head coach is an active member of the University of Maryland and greater Baltimore-Washington, D.C. community. Williams is involved in extensive charity, fund-raising and public speaking events throughout the year, particularly in the offseason.

In September 2004, University President C.D. Mote Jr. announced that Williams will co-chair the scholarship component of Maryland's ongoing \$250 million fund-raising campaign. In addition to a pledge of a half-million dollars of his own for academic scholarships at the university, Williams will represent the University at various functions and perform various networking duties to spearhead the fund-raising efforts.

Williams has been heavily involved in the NABC's Coaches vs. Cancer efforts, serving as the national chair during the 2008-09 season. The program is a partnership between the National Association of Basketball Coaches and the American Cancer Society. The coaches participating in this program are dedicated to fighting cancer through increased support for research, patient services, and prevention education.

Williams has also worked with Maryland grad Boomer Esiason and others to benefit the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation, hosting charity basketball games and golf events.

For the past two years, Williams has served as the honorary chairman for the Walk Far for N.A.A.R., which has raised more than \$1 million dollars for the National Alliance of Autism Research. He has also chaired the Salvation Army's FORE Kids golf tournament in 2003 and 2004, which raises proceeds for Washington, D.C.'s youth.

Vasquez's 30 points were the most scored by a Maryland player this season. He led four Terrapins in double-figure scoring, including a dozen by Jordan Williams, 11 from Landon Milbourne and 10 off the bench from Adrian Bowie.

The Terrapins went nearly 4 minutes between field goals in the extra session before Jordan Williams' stickback tied it at 83 with 52 seconds left.

Smith drove down the lane and lofted a successful one-hander to put Wake Forest up by two. Maryland hustled downcourt and called timeout with 14.8 seconds left, and Vasquez's 3 over Smith bounced off the iron with about 10 seconds.

The rebound trickled out to Sean Mosley and he missed a 3 with about 3 seconds left.

Mosley finished with 13 rebounds to lead Maryland, the most by a Terrapin in a single game this season. The Terps outrebounded Wake Forest, 43-41, in the game.

Maryland wasn't about to ruin Gary Williams' 1,000th game as a college head coach by losing. Not at home, certainly not against an Atlantic Coast Conference foe.

The Terrapins didn't even make Williams sweat. Greivis Vasquez scored 17 of his 19 points in the second half, Landon Milbourne finished with 18, and Maryland rolled to its most lopsided ACC victory in nearly seven years, 88-64 over North Carolina State.

Williams is 638-362 over a 32-year coaching career that began at American University and included stints at Boston College and Ohio State. He is 431-234 in 21 seasons at Maryland, where he won the 2002 national championship.

Williams' latest victory at his alma mater, combined with Virginia's loss at Wake Forest, lifted the Terrapins (13-5, 3-1) into a tie atop the ACC standings.

The 24-point margin was the largest for Maryland in a league game since a 91-52 rout of Clemson on Feb. 25, 2003.

After Milbourne opened the second half with a layup to put the Terrapins up by 10, Vasquez followed with a 3-pointer that he punctuated with a little dance for the sellout crowd. Minutes later, Vasquez and Milbourne connected from beyond the arc to make it 59-41 with 13:54 remaining.

The margin swelled to 22 points with 5 minutes left.
