**SCHEDULE CHANGES**

Maryland has three schedule changes remaining due to conflicts and postponements, two of which are conference match-ups. All are home contests to be held at Ludwig Field. Changes start with the Holy Cross game, previously the Terps' final regular season home contest scheduled for Nov. 9, which has been moved to Oct. 31 at 7 p.m. The Nov. 2 game against conference-rival Virginia has now been moved to Nov. 4 at 1 p.m. The final rescheduled game is the NC State game that was to be played on Sept. 16. That game will now be played at 1 p.m. on Nov. 11 and will be the Terps' final home game of the regular season. Additionally, Maryland's opponent on Nov. 7 has changed from Fairfield to Manhattan. Game time will still be at 7 p.m.

**SUMED MAKING HIS MARK**

Maryland redshirt-sophomore **Sumed Ibrahim** (T-male, Ghana) is on the doorstep of adding his name to the Terps' all-time single-season assists chart. Sumed has seven assists this season, and needs one more to tie four Terps who are in the No. 8 spot with eight.

**SUMED HEATS UP**

Redshirt-sophomore **Sumed Ibrahim** has been hot all season for the Terps, scoring goals and setting them up with great frequency. The Ghana-native is averaging 1.4 ppg and leads the team in goals (5) and assists (8). Thirteen games in, Sumed has scored over five-times as much as his freshman year totals when a nagging groin injury held the midfielder back. That year, he scored one goal and had two assists in 20 games.

**UM AGAINST RANKED TEAMS**

The Terps will meet at least two more ranked teams this season, Clemson (No. 9 NSCAA) and Virginia (No. 4 NSCAA). The Terps are currently 1-2 against ranked teams this season. UM has a 2-1 overtime win against then-No. 7 UCLA in the season opener on Aug. 31 at the Virginia Soccer Classic and a 2-1 loss against Creighton on Sept. 7 in the Maryland/FILA Classic, when they were ranked 11th by *Soccer America*. This past Sunday, Maryland traveled to then-No. 12 North Carolina and dropped a 2-1 decision to the Heels at Fetzer Field.

**TERPS IN THE ACC STATS**

Both **Sumed Ibrahim** and **Noah Palmer** (Williamsburg, Va.) are ranked in the ACC stats this week in several categories. Sumed is tied for first in assists per game with a 0.62 average and assists with eight. He is also tied for sixth in points with 18 and tied for seventh in scoring with a 1.38 ppg average.

Palmer is fifth in both goals against average with a 0.90 mark and save percentage with a .767 average. His saves tie him for fourth in the conference with a 2.92 average.

**V-TAG RETURNS TO LINEUP**

Terp fans saw a familiar face on the field again when sophomore **Bryan Vitagliano** checked into the Loyola game at the 34:17 mark. "V-Tag" to his Terp teammates had been struggling with a nagging injury early in the season, but finally saw his first action against Loyola and logged some significant time off the bench for UM. Vitagliano entered 2001 as the second-highest returning scorer, scoring four goals and four assists last season. He played an intense 63 minutes at Duke and has also made appearances in five other games, although for less time.

**ROHRMAN HONORED BY CSN**

*College Soccer News* recently named Maryland coach **Jeff Rohrman** one of the nation's top assistants in the country. An excellent teacher with a vast knowledge of the game, CSN said that Rohrman is "a talented coach and a very natural fit with Maryland program head coach **Sasho Cirovski**. They both share a genuine passion for the game that is reflected in the type of teams Maryland puts on the field." Rohrman has been with the Terps since 1994. A 1986 graduate of Wisconsin-Milwaukee, he and Cirovski played together for the Panthers for two years.

**SUMED SCORES HAT TRICK**

Redshirt-sophomore **Sumed Ibrahim** became the second current Terp to score a hat trick when he netted three goals in Maryland's 5-1 victory over American in the Maryland/FILA Classic on Sept. 9. Abe Thompson is the only other Terrapin on the roster to score three goals in a game. Thompson did it against Monmouth last season in Maryland's 5-1 victory over the Hawks on Oct. 4.
