#### OLE MISS HOSTS CENTENARY IN HOME OPENER

The Rebels make their 2005-06 debut at Tad Smith Coliseum Saturday against Centenary. Ole Miss came out of the season-opening Jim Thorpe Classic in Albuquerque, N.M. with a 2-1 record. Senior forward **Londrick Nolen** led the way averaging 11.0 points and 5.0 boards in earning All-Tournament honors. Junior guard **Todd Abernethy** posted 16 points and 6 boards in the victory over Southern Utah, while sophomore center **Dwayne Curtis** provided the punch in the South Carolina State win with his first double-double as a Rebel with 18 points and 12 rebounds.

#### BARNES BEGINS EIGHTH SEASON AS REBEL MENTOR

**Rod Barnes** is beginning his eighth season at the helm of the Ole Miss Rebel basketball program and took the bench for his 200th game as a head coach in 2004-05. The 2001 Naismith and Collegelnsider.com National Coach of the Year, Barnes has a 129-94 record. Barnes' 129 coaching victories in his first 223 games is the most of any Ole Miss coach over that span and is the second-most wins in school history. His .578 winning percentage is the highest of any Rebel coach of seven years or more.

In 2000-01, Barnes was the SEC Coach of the Year, and guided Ole Miss to a school-record 27 wins and the program's first NCAA Tournament Sweet 16

birth. Another winning season and postseason tournament followed in 2001-02 — both were the sixth straight for the Ole Miss program.

Barnes was hired as the Rebel head coach on April 9, 1998. A 1988 graduate of Ole Miss, Barnes served as an assistant under Evans from 1993-98. During his time as an assistant coach, the Rebels compiled a record of 76-63 and won back-to-back Southeastern Conference Western Division titles and received consecutive NCAA Tournament berths in 1997 and 1998. Barnes played at Ole Miss from 1984-88 and was an All-American honorable mention his senior season. He is the only person in SEC history to earn both All-SEC and SEC Coach of the Year honors.

**SCOUTING THE GENTLEMEN**

Under the direction of former Arkansas assistant Rob Flaska, Centenary returns three lettermen, including two starters, from last year's 3-24 squad that finished ninth in the Mid-Continent Conference. Heading the list of returnees is sophomore guard Tyrone Hamilton, who averaged 12.5 points a season ago. The Gentlemen split their first two games of the year, defeating UT-Tyler 84-73 and falling at SMU 85-67 on Tuesday. A pair of JUCO transfer forwards have led the way at the season's start. Off the bench, Jason Underwood is averaging a team-high 14.0 points per game, while Alexander Starr has produced 12.0 points, 6.0 rebounds and 5.5 assists.

**OLE MISS-CENTENARY STATE SERIES**

This game between the Gentlemen and Rebels is the 13th all-time meeting and only the second since 1966. The all-time series is tied at 6-6 and extends back to the 1920s. The teams split their two encounters that decade, and matched up eight times during the 1960s, with the Gentlemen prevailing in five of those games. Ole Miss won the last bout 72-60 in 2003-04.

**REBELS IN HOME OPENERS**

Ole Miss has an overall record of 75-13 record (.852 winning percentage) in its first home game of the year, and defeated Tennessee Tech 91-68 in last year's home opener. The Rebels have won eight of the last nine home openers.

**BOMBING TREYS**

Ole Miss has been deadly from 3-point range at the season's start, firing at 44.7 percent. The Rebels hit 6-of-12 against South Carolina State and 11-of-21 3-pointers against Southern Utah. Senior forward **Londrick Nolen** has nailed 8-of-14 (57.1) in 3s, while freshman forward **Xavier Hansbro** is 5-of-9 (55.6). In the win over the Thunderbirds, eight of the Rebels' final nine field goals were 3-pointers, and the one two-pointer was a **Brandon Patterson** jumper in which he toed the 3-point line. Hansbro hit 4-of-6 3s, and Nolen

and **Todd Abernethy** were each 3-of-4. Ole Miss made good on 11 or more 3-pointers only four times last season, when the team shot 36.3 percent in 3s.

**CHARITABLE STRIPE**

The Rebels are off to a productive start of the season from the free throw line, connecting on 37-of-51 for a 72.5 percentage. That figure is an 11.6 percent upgrade from last year's team percentage of 60.9. Sophomore **Jerme Parnell** shot 45.2 percent a year ago but is an improved 9-for-10 so far this year. Freshman **Mike Smith** has been good on 5-of-6 from the stripe, while junior **Bam Doyne** is 4-for-4.

**REBELS VERSUS THE MID-CON**

The Rebels have an all-time record of 14-7 versus current members of the Mid-Continent conference. Since 1992, Ole Miss is 10-1 against the Mid-Con, with the lone loss being the NCAA Tournament upset to Valparaiso in 1998. The Rebels knocked off an MCC foe in this year's season opener, beating Southern Utah, 69-62. The following chart shows Ole Miss' all-time results versus teams from the Mid-Continent Conference:

**DE-FENSE, DE-FENSE**

Throughout his Rebel tenure, defense has become a trademark of **Rod Barnes'** squads, and that was certainly evident in Sunday's win over South Carolina State. Ole Miss limited the Bulldogs to 47 points, making 28 times in Barnes' eight years at the helm that the opposition was contained below 50. The Rebels also forced S.C. State into 25 turnovers. Ole Miss forced 12 opponents into 18 or more turnovers last year.

In 2004-05, the Rebels finished fourth in the SEC in scoring defense (64.1), and held nationally-ranked Kentucky to 53 points — 22.6 below their average at the time. Ole Miss contained Alabama 14.8 points below their scoring average at 66. The Rebels limited two opponents under 50 points and 12 foes under 60 points. Ole Miss held its opponent in the 30s in shoot-ing percentage seven times last season.

**REBS-DOGS TO PLAY ON ESPN CLASSIC**

It was announced last week that Ole Miss' Feb. 18 matchup at Mississippi State will be televised national-ly on ESPN Classic at a newly scheduled time of 2:30 p.m. CT. The game is part of SEC Throwback Week, and both teams will be wearing throwback uniforms. This will mark the Rebels' first live appearance on ESPN Classic, which reaches 55 million homes.

**"TAD PAD" SWEET "TAD PAD"**

The "Tad Pad" has proven to be one of the tough-est arenas in the nation for opposing teams to play. Ole Miss has won 112 of its last 138 games (.812 win-ning percentage) at home, including homecourt win-ning streaks of 29, 20 and 15 games. The Rebels have an all-time record of 354-173 (.672 winning percent-age) at Tad Smith Coliseum, which opened in the 1965-66 season.

In head coach **Rod Barnes'** era, the Rebels have a home record of 84-25 (.771 winning percentage), including a 35-21 homecourt record against SEC foes (.625 winning percentage). The following shows Ole Miss' home overall and league records under Barnes:

**TOUGH ON NON-CONFERENCE FOES**

Since the 1993-94 season, the Rebels have post-ed an 114-39 record (.745 winning percentage) versus non-conference opponents. Non-conference foes have found Ole Miss especially tough under head coach **Rod Barnes** (1998-99 through 2005-06), as the Rebels have an impressive 79-22 mark (.782 winning percentage) against out-of-conference teams. Ole Miss has been dominant against non-SEC clubs at home. Last December's loss to Florida State was only the Rebels' fourth non-conference home loss since 1995.

**MR. NOVEMBERS**

The Rebels love to play games in November, and it shows in their record in contests played during that month. Since the 1990-91 campaign, Ole Miss has a 37-9 record (.804 winning percentage) in the month of November. The Rebels posted 11 straight November victories from 1998 through 2000.

**STRONG STARTER**

Against Southern Utah, **Todd Abernethy** contin-ued his outstanding play in season openers with a team-high 16 points with 6 rebounds. The junior guard also topped the team in scoring in last year's season opener against South Carolina State, dropping in a career-high 18 points with 5 rebounds and 4 assists. In addition, Abernethy began his career with a 9-point, 6-assist effort against Arkansas State in the 2003-04 season opener.

**REBELS INK TWO FOR 2006-07**

Ole Miss strengthened both its frontcourt and backcourt last week, receiving national letters of intent from **Solomon Bozeman**, a 6-foot-1, 165-pound

guard, and **Herbert Terry**, a 6-foot-7, 215-pound forward. Bozeman and Terry will attend Ole Miss beginning in the 2006-07 academic year.

The son of former Rebel assistant coach Eric Bozeman, Solomon was the *Oxford Eagle* Player of the Year in 2005, when he scored 25.1 points per game as a junior at Oxford High School. Bozeman also averaged 6.6 assists, 4.9 rebounds and 1.9 steals per game while shooting 53 percent from the field and 39 percent from three-point range. Bozeman will finish his prep career this season at Magnolia High School in Magnolia, Ark., where his father is the head coach at Southern Arkansas. Eric Bozeman accepted the head position at SAU after seven years on Barnes' Ole Miss staff.

A native of Indianapolis, Terry averaged 14 points and 13 rebounds a game last year for Southport High School, where he also earned state track honors in the high jump. He transferred from Southport to Southside High School in Fort Wayne, Ind., for his senior season. Terry played summer ball with Fort Wayne-based Blessed IJN and dropped in over 30 points a game with 14 boards at the prestigious Hoosier Shootout in July.

Also new to the Rebel lineup in 2006-07 will be **Justin Cerasoli**, who transferred to Ole Miss from Seton Hall in July. The 6-foot-5, 180-pound guard is practicing with the team this fall but is ineligible for the 2005-06 season by NCAA transfer rules. Cerasoli may begin playing in the 2006-07 campaign with three years of eligibility remaining

**CURTIS AMONG NATION'S TOP TRANSFERS**

Ole Miss sophomore center **Dwayne Curtis** was named one of the nation's top 20 transfers by *Athlon Sports* in their preseason college basketball annual. Curtis redshirted last season and practiced with the Rebels after transferring from Auburn in May 2004. As a freshman with the Tigers, he played in 19 games with five starts and averaged 2.9 points and 2.3 rebounds in 10.3 minutes per game. The Chicago, Ill., native shot 58 percent from the field.

**NEW BEGINNINGS FOR REBELS**

Ole Miss adds seven new faces in 2005-06 to a Rebel squad that returns six letterwinners. The lone starter among that group is senior forward **Londrick Nolen**, who finished first on the team in blocks (0.6) last season, tied for first in rebounding (4.4), second in scoring (9.8) and third in steals (0.9).

After earning SEC Sixth Man of the Year honors a year ago, junior guard **Todd Abernethy** returns to the

starting lineup this season. The Carmel, Ind., native boasts career averages of 6.9 points and 2.7 assists with a 2.2/1 assist/turnover ratio.

Sophomore center **Dwayne Curtis** will see his first action with the Rebels this year after transferring from Auburn, where he played in 19 games starting five for the Tigers in 2003-04. Also joining the Rebels is an incoming class that was ranked as high as third in the nation by recruiting publications.

**STILL THE BEST (IN THE WEST)**

**OLE MISS FACES STRONG SLATE**

With 10 opponents that advanced to 2005 post-season play, Ole Miss faces another challenging basketball schedule in 2005-06. The slate boasts 17 home games and nine matchups set for TV.

The non-conference slate is highlighted by home encounters with Memphis, Saint Louis and two-time Southland Conference champion Southeastern Louisiana.

The Rebels are beginning SEC play on the road for the seventh time in Barnes' eight years at the helm, and will start the conference schedule against Alabama for the first time since the 1977-78 season. Ole Miss faces each Western Division opponent (Alabama, Arkansas, Auburn, LSU and Mississippi

State) twice on a home-and-home basis.

Ole Miss hosts SEC Eastern Division foes South Carolina, Florida and Vanderbilt, and travel to Georgia, Tennessee and Kentucky. The SEC Tournament returns to Nashville's Gaylord Entertainment Center.

**TOP OF THE CLASS**

The Rebels' 2004 signing class was tabbed as one of the nation's best. *HoopScoop Online* rated the class third in college basketball, while *Rivals.com* had it 16th-best in their ranking. Four different states are represented in the class.

**MR. DO-IT-ALL**

Some people think they can do everything, and last year **Londrick Nolen** proved at times that he could. The senior forward started all 26 of the 31 games a year ago, and filled the stat line in the process. Nolen topped the team in blocks (19), tied for the team lead in rebounding (4.4), finished second in scoring (9.8) and third in steals (29). Nolen punched in double-figures in 16 games with three 20-point outings, including 21 at Auburn when he dropped in 18 second-half points. Nolen notched his first double-double in the Red and Blue with 19 points and 12 rebounds at Arkansas. Facing UL-Monroe, he notched a season-high 25 points on 10-of-12 shooting, including 4-of-5 threes, with five assists. Nolen tallied a team-best 21 points and 5-of-7 treys at Arkansas State.

**SEC SIXTH MAN OF YEAR**

**Todd Abernethy** was the SEC Sixth Man of the Year last season. A sophomore guard and team captain, Abernethy became the first Rebel to receive the honor, which was first awarded by the conference last year. The Carmel, Ind. native started the first 34 games of his collegiate career, but moved to the sixth-man role against Memphis in December. In his 21 games off the pine, Abernethy provided Ole Miss with quality minutes at both point guard and shooting guard. As a reserve, he posted eight double-figure scoring outings and seven games with four or more assists.

**ADVANCED AGAIN**

After a thrilling 53-52 opening-round win over South Carolina, Ole Miss advanced to the SEC Tournament second round in 2005 for the second time in three years and the sixth time in the last nine tournaments. The Rebels' season ended with the second-round loss to Alabama.

**ACADEMIC STAR**

**Todd Abernethy** earned his second straight SEC Academic Honor Roll award in 2005. The junior guard is a Banking & Finance major with a 3.41 GPA. Abernethy was an SEC Freshman Academic Honor Roll recipient in 2004, when he also earned SEC All-Freshman Team accolades.

**COMING UP SHORT**

Ole Miss was on the short end of some heart-breaking battles a year ago, particularly in conference play. The Rebels dropped 10 games by 11 points or less, including eight of the team's 12 SEC losses. Ole Miss either led or was within two possessions inside the final minute in seven of the 12 SEC defeats. The Rebels led eighth-ranked Kentucky until the final 3:41, and had two shot attempts to tie the game in the 53-50 heartbreaker. Ole Miss was on top of No. 22 Alabama by as much as eight points in the second stanza, and held a three-point edge over Arkansas with 1:15 remaining. The Rebels held double-digit leads in both games with Mississippi State and missed the game-tying three with 20 ticks left in Starkville. In the regular-season finale, Ole Miss led South Carolina by as much as 14 before falling in overtime.

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. (AP) - Dwayne Curtis scored 18 points and had 12 rebounds and Ole Miss took advantage of 25 turnovers by South Carolina State in a 71-47 win at the Jim Thorpe Classic.

Curtis, a 6-foot-8, 290-pound sophomore, made 7-of-9 shots, most of them layups over the smaller Bulldogs' frontline. Curtis, who transferred to Ole Miss (2-1) from Auburn, scored six straight points midway through the second half to give the Rebels a 51-34 lead.

Chris Lee had 10 points, leading South Carolina State (1-2).

Ole Miss scored 29 points off South Carolina State's turnovers. The Bulldogs had 16 turnovers in the first half.

It was close through the first 12 minutes and South Carolina State trailed 16-15 before Ole Miss went on a 16-2 run. Londrick Nolen, who finished with 14 points, had a 3-pointer and a pair of free throws in the burst.

Ole Miss hit 50 percent from the field and made 6-of-12 from 3-point range.

The Rebels' only points in that stretch was a tip-in by Trey Hampton. It was Ole Miss' only field goal in the final 11 minutes of the first half.

Ole Miss hit just 14 of 55 shots (25.5 percent) and was 4-of-24 on 3-pointers. The Rebels had no one in double figures, with Bam Doyne and Mike Smith the team's high scorers with 7 points each.

New Mexico also dominated the rebounding by a margin of 50-24.

New Mexico hit 14 of 27 3s, with five players hitting at least two 3-pointers. Walters had a trio of 3s, all in the first half.

Walk-on Blake Harden and Chad Toppert each scored 11 points for New Mexico and Anthony Teague scored 10.
