Game Day Headlines

☞ Ole Miss is 5-0 at Tad Smith Coliseum this season.

☞ The Lady Rebels are 10-2 on the season for the first time since the 2000-01 season, when the Ole Miss posted 11-straight wins to start the season.

☞ Ole Miss is 17-6 in Southeastern Conference openers. Ole Miss has never faced Florida in an SEC opener. Head Coach Ron Aldy is 1-4 in SEC openers with the lone win coming in last year's 81-46 win over Arkansas.

☞ The Florida game will mark the first game of the second semester for Ole Miss as classes started on Jan. 8. The Lady Rebels went 5-2 during the holiday break.

☞ The Lady Rebels have forced more turnovers than they have committed in nine-straight games and in 10-of-12 games this season.

☞ Ole Miss has gotten to the free throw line more often than their opponent in 8-of-12 games this season, shooting 240 free throws, compared to their opponents 185 free throw attempts.

LAST TIME OUT

The Lady Rebels staged a furious comeback in the last few minutes of the game to steal a 54-53 win over Temple. Down 10 points with just over four minutes remaining in the game, Ole Miss outscored the Owls 13-2 to claim their 10th victory of the season. Ashley Johnson and Genice Terry combined for three steals, two assists and six points during the last stretch and led Ole Miss with 18 points and 11 points, respectively, in the game.

ALDY IS IN SIXTH YEAR

Ron Aldy is in his sixth year (77-80) at the helm of the Lady Rebel basketball program. After having achieved success on every level as either a head coach or an assistant coach, Aldy is using his knowledge and love of the game to bring the storied Ole Miss basketball program back to national prominence. He has dedicated himself to making Ole Miss a winner on and off the court. Aldy has guided the Lady Rebels to postseason play in two of his five seasons in Oxford. He led Ole Miss to a 17-13 overall record and a trip to the WNIT in 2000-01. Off the court, the Lady Rebels have made tremendous strides academically and in the community, as well. Ole Miss has placed six players on the SEC Academic Honor Roll in three of the last four seasons. Since Aldy came to Oxford, all of his outgoing seniors have received their bachelor's degrees with the exception of three, one of whom will graduate in December and the other two in May. Aldy and his staff have seen to it that the Lady Rebels get involved in the Oxford community. The Ole Miss players have helped build a community playground, visited the elderly and participated in many other activities in the area.

SCOUTING FLORIDA

The Gators enter Thursday's contest with an 8-4 record that includes wins over Florida State, Miami and Virginia. UF has suffered losses to UC-Santa Barbara, N.C. State, Houston and Oregon State all away from the friendly confines of the O'Connell Center. Freshman forward Bernice Cosby leads Florida in scoring with 14.8 points per game and rebounding with 9.3 boards per game. Senior forward Courtney Cooper is second on the team in both points and rebounds as she averages 14.5 points and 8.5 rebounds per contest.

OLE MISS-FLORIDA HISTORY

Thursday's game will be the 20th meeting between the two schools, with Florida leading the series 11-8. Ole Miss won the first eight games in the series, but has now lost 11-straight to the Gators, including two losses last season. The Lady Rebels fell to Florida 75-73 in Gainesville and 74-73 in Oxford. Ole Miss owns a 6-4 record against Florida in Oxford.

COMMON OPPONENTS

Outside of Southeastern Conference opponents, Ole Miss and Florida do not share any common opponents.

LADY REBEL-GATOR CONNECTIONS

Ole Miss does not have any players from the state of Florida on the roster and UF does not field any native Mississippians on their roster. Lady Rebel head coach Ron Aldy will be facing the Gators for the seventh time since taking over at Ole Miss. Aldy was the UF associate head coach for five seasons prior to arriving in Oxford. Florida compiled a 110-44 record during Aldy's five seasons in Gainesville, including five trips to the NCAA Tournament. UF assistant coach Matthew Mitchell is a native of Louisville, Miss., the same hometown as Ole Miss assistant coach Kim Rosamond. Mitchell is a 1995 graduate of Mississippi State and was a teacher and coach at two different Mississippi Academies prior to working at Florida.

INJURY REPORT

Junior forward **Tywanna Inmon** will make her second return to the court this season after missing the Temple game with head pain. Inmon was elbowed in the face during practice, suffering a cut between her eyes that required stitches to close. Inmon suffered head pain associated with the wound and did not play against the Owls. Inmon missed four games earlier in the season with a sprained knee. Junior guard/forward **Tenisha Gist** will be sidelined for four to six weeks with a stress fracture in her right lower leg. Gist had started all 12 games prior to her injury.

THREES ARE THE KEY

Ole Miss has made more three-pointers than their opponents in 10-of-12 games this season. The Lady Rebels are 10-0 when connecting on more trifectas than their opponent. In losses to Oakland and Florida International, Ole Miss made one less three-pointer than their opponent. UM has made 77 threes on the season compared to 44 threes for their opponents.

SCORING ALL AROUND

Of the 12 players on the Ole Miss roster, 11 have scored in double-figures. The lone player to not score in double figures is junior forward **Tia Watson**. Watson, however, scored in double figures in both of the Lady Rebels' exhibition games.

JOHNSON MAKING A NAME FOR HERSELF

Freshman guard **Ashley Johnson** has been making waves lately. The 5-9 Shelbyville, Tenn., native has averaged 17.5 points per game over the last four outings. Johnson has nailed 27-of-58 shots from the floor during the four games, including 10-of-20 three-point attempts. Johnson is leading the SEC in three-point shooting percentage as she has connected on 18-of-32 for 56.3 percent on the season.

TERRY EARNS ALL-TOURNAMENT HONOR

Junior guard **Genice Terry** scored a season-high 20 points to lead Ole Miss in the championship

game of the Sun & Fun Classic in Miami. Terry also tallied team highs in steals (4) and assists (3) in the Lady Rebel loss to FIU. Terry collected five points, two steals and two assists in the Ole Miss opening round win over Georgia State. She was the fifth Lady Rebel to earn All-Tournament honors this season.

TERRY AND JOHNSON FORM DYNAMIC DUO OFF-THE-BENCH

Junior guard **Genice Terry** and freshman guard **Ashley Johnson** are combining forces to provide Ole Miss with a solid one-two punch off-the-bench. Johnson is averaging 9.5 points per game (2nd on team) and Terry is adding 6.4 points per game. The two led Ole Miss in scoring with 18 (Johnson) and 11 (Terry) points in the win over Temple. Terry led Ole Miss against FIU with a season-high 20 points, while Johnson added 16 in the loss.

AMBER FROM THE BLOCK

Lady Rebel sophomore center **Amber Watts** has gotten out of the blocks quickly and is leading Ole Miss in both scoring and rebounding. The 6-3 Jackson, Miss., native averages 12.0 points and 8.6 rebounds per contest. Watts has led Ole Miss in scoring in five games and in rebounding in six games.

JOHNSON GETS HER SHINE ON

Ole Miss freshman **Ashley Johnson** turned her game up a notch in the Bahamas as the 5-9 guard recorded a game-high 23 points in the consolation win over Marshall. Johnson entered the game with just over 11 minutes remaining in the first half of play and went on to score 20 points in the first period. Johnson connected on 8-of-12 shots from the field, including 4-of-6 from beyond the arc. Johnson scored another three points in the second half and earned All-Tournament honors for her efforts.

OLE MISS CLAIMS TOURNAMENT TITLE

The Lady Rebels defeated host Illinois-Chicago, 65-64, to capture the title of the UIC Thanksgiving Tournament. Sophomore **Elizabeth Cansdale** made one-of-two free throws with 23.2 seconds left in the game for the difference in the game. Cansdale led Ole Miss in scoring with 16 points, while junior **Genice Terry** chipped in 10. Freshman **Ellen Buchanan** led the Lady Rebels in rebounding with nine, followed by sophomore **Amber Watts** with eight boards. Sophomore **Carletta Brown** dished out a team high four assists.

WATTS EARNS MVP HONORS

Ole Miss sophomore center **Amber Watts** was named tournament MVP at the UIC Thanksgiving Classic. Watts recorded 28 points and 17 rebounds in the two-game tournament. It is her first MVP honor of her career.

BUCHANAN AND CANSDALE EARN ALL-TOURNAMENT HONORS

Freshman forward **Elen Buchanan** and sophomore guard **Elizabeth Cansdale** joined **Amber Watts** on the All-Tournament team at the UIC Thanksgiving Tournament. Buchanan racked up 24 points and 13 rebounds, while Candale scored 28 points and grabbed five boards during the two-game stint. It was the first All-Tournament honor for both.

CANSDALE IN THE CLUTCH

Sophomore **Elizabeth Cansdale** led Ole Miss in scoring in the championship game of the UIC Thanksgiving Tournament with 16 points. She scored 11-straight points during a stretch in the first half for the Lady Rebels, however her most important point of the game was her last. With the game knotted at 64-all, Cansdale stepped to the free throw line and hit one-of-two charity shots for the final difference in the game as Ole Miss went on to win the game and the tournament with the 65-64 margin.

GIST HAS CAREER DAY AGAINST SOUTHERN

Junior **Tenisha Gist** posted several career highs in the Lady Rebels' season opening 66-53 win over Southern University. Gist's set new marks in points (14), field goal attempts (9), three-point field goal attempts (4) and minutes played (30). She also tied a career high in rebounds (7).

CANSDALE IN THE CLUTCH PART II

Elizabeth Cansdale is leading the SEC in free throw shooting percentage after the first eight weeks of competition. Cansdale has made 17-of-18 from the charity stripe, good for 94.4 percent. Cansdale's success at the line should come as no surprise as she has her name in the Basketball Hall of Fame after winning the National Elk's Free Throw Shooting Contest in 1996. Cansdale

made 23-of-25 free throws to win the national title at age 13.

CROSSING OVER

Junior forward **Erin Newsom** recently joined the Ole Miss women's basketball team after completing her four-year Lady Rebel career in volleyball and scored 11 points and grabbed six rebounds in just her second game. Newsom, a 6-2 Argyle, Texas native, was a standout basketball player at Northwest High School before deciding to play volleyball in college. She was the starting middle blocker on the Lady Rebel volleyball team and was a team captain in 2002. She will have two seasons of basketball eligibility. Newsom is one of two two-sport athletes on the volleyball team as junior setter Jade Polonich also plays golf at Ole Miss.

DOUBLING UP

Sophomore center **Amber Watts** tallied her fifth career double-digit rebounding game in the Lady Rebel win over Western Kentucky. Watts grabbed a career-high 14 caroms in the win over the Lady Toppers. The 14 rebounds marks the fifth time in Watts' young career that she posted 10 or more rebounds as she tallied 12 last year versus Fairleigh Dickinson and 10 against Temple and had 13 boards in the 2002-03 season-opening win over Southern University and 11 rebounds in the win over Birmingham Southern. For the season, Watts is nearly averaging a double-double as she records 13.1 points and 8.7 rebounds per contest.

SIX NEWCOMERS JOIN LADY REBELS IN 2002-03

New faces will abound as the 2002-03 Lady Rebel basketball season gets underway. The new players have arrived on the roster in a variety of ways. 600 ON THE HORIZON

With 594 all time wins in the history of the Lady Rebel program, Ole Miss will be searching for its 600th victory during the 2002-03 season. The Lady Rebels have put together 594 wins to just 273 losses in the 29 seasons in Oxford.

Ole Miss will appear on television three times this year.
