OLE MISS HEAD COACH

MISSY DICKERSON

Dickerson is in her first season at the helm of the Rebels after leading Texas A&M-Corpus Christi to three straight Big South Championships and three straight NCAA Tournament berths. With her 2-8 record at Ole Miss, her three-year overall record as a Division I head coach is now 114-64 (.640 winning pct.), including a 42-11 2005 mark with the Islanders.

BALL STATE HEAD COACH

TERRI LAUX

Laux is entering her 10th year as head coach at Ball State. Her nine-year record at BSU is 209-253-1, while she owns a career mark of 361-501-3 in 18 seasons.

EVANSVILLE HEAD COACH

GWEN LEWIS

After a 4-1 start to the 2006 season, Gwen Lewis has moved to 414-357-1 in her 14-year coaching career, all with Evansville. She guided the Purple Aces to Missouri Valley Conference Championships in 2000 and 2002 and their first-ever NCAA Tournament appearances in 2002.

LAST TIME OUT

Ole Miss struggled to an 0-5 record this past weekend at the FAU Dunkin' Donuts Classic in Boca Raton, Fla. The Rebels fell twice to host Florida Atlantic and once each to Missouri State, Long Island and Florida International. Despite out-hitting each of their five opponents, the Rebels were unable to finish their opportunities, leaving 42 runners on base over the weekend. Senior SS **Rebecca McIntire** and sophomore 3B **Lauren Rowe** led the Rebels at the plate with five hits each over the weekend. Senior RHP **Dana Brill** had a pair of solid outings, giving up 2 runs (1 earned) and striking out 7 in 7 2/3 innings of work.

SCOUTING THE UE TOURNEY FIELD

Ball State will be playing their first games of the season this weekend. The Cardinals were 19-37 last season and finished sixth in the western division of the MAC with a 6-16 conference record. Their top returning hitter is junior OF Kelli Jeziorski, who led the club with a .272 average a year ago. The top returning pitcher is Nicki Hellem, who finished 8-10 with a 3.31 ERA last season.

Evansville is 4-1 on the early season after posting wins over Minnesota, N.C. State, Miami-Ohio and Middle Tennessee State, and dropping a 12-7 contest at Auburn. Sophomore 1B/P Brittany Herald leads the Purple Aces with a .462 batting average, while she has a home run and 4 RBI. Senior 2B/OF Alicia Laraway boasts a .438 average with 2 HRs and 5 RBI. Freshman Ashley Hobbs leads the club in the circle with a 1.89 ERA and a 3-0 record in four starts.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN

The Rebels will be traveling to their third of four tournaments this weekend before playing their first home game, which is slated for March 8 vs. Southeastern Louisiana. Ole Miss is scheduled to play a total of 19 road games before that first home contest. The Rebels have made trips to Lafayette, La., and Boca Raton, Fla., while they will play the next two weekends in Evansville, Ind., and Austin, Texas.

PERFECTING THE PILFER

The Rebels have yet to be denied a stolen base in the young season and will look to continue their **perfect 15-for-15 stealing success** this weekend.

Junior OF **Vanessa Gibbs** has three swipes to her credit, while sophomore 3B **Lauren Rowe**, senior SS **Rebecca McIntire** and senior CF **Stacy McCommon** each have two pilfers.

FRESHMEN ON FIRE

Freshman 2B **Lisa Conchos** and catcher **Michelle May** have been key parts of the Ole Miss offense in their first games at the collegiate level.

Conchos leads the team with a .367 average, 7 RBI and 5 runs, while she is tied for the team lead with 2 doubles and 13 total bases. She went 3-for-3 with 5 RBI in her first-ever college game, helping the Rebels to a 12-1 opening win over Grambling State. She was named to the Louisiana Classics All-Tournament team.

Ole Miss has a 7-3 record all-time against teams that currently comprise the Mid-American Conference. The Rebels are 2-0 vs. Ball State, 1-0 vs. Bowling Green, 1-1 vs. Central Michigan, 1-0 vs. Kent State, 0-1 vs. Miami-Ohio, 1-0 vs. Northern Illinois, 0-1 vs. Toledo and 1-0 vs. Western Michigan.

OLE MISS vs. MISSOURI VALLEY

Ole Miss has a 15-17 record all-time against teams that currently comprise the MVC. The Rebels are 2-0 vs. Creighton, 0-1 vs. Drake, 4-7 vs. Evansville, 1-1 vs. Illinois State, 1-0 vs. Indiana State, 3-3 vs. Missouri State, 1-0 vs. Northern Illinois, 2-5 vs. Southern Illinois and 1-0 vs. Wichita State.

May has been the cleanup hitter in 7-of-10 contests for Ole Miss, and is batting .296 with a team-lead tying 2 doubles, along with 3 RBI, 3 runs and 10 total bases.

GETTING ON THE SCOREBOARD

The first team to break the goose eggs on the scoreboard has been a good indicator of the outcomes early in the 2006 campaign.

Ole Miss scored first in the team's two victories this season, but have allowed the opponent to break the ice first in all eight losses thus far.

FORMER REBEL BRITTE HARDY TO BE HONORED

As part of the celebration of the 35th Anniversary of African-Americans at Ole Miss and in connection with Black History Month, former softball player Britte Hardy (2000-04) is being honored this weekend along with the other Rebel greats who were the first Black student-athletes to participate in their respective sports.

As a senior in 2004, Hardy was the only player on the Rebel squad to play in all 52 games. She led the team with 43 hits and set career highs in steals, walks, RBI, triples and at bats during the campaign. The native of Peachtree City, Ga., was the All-State Southside Player of the Year at McIntosh High School and also set five school track records, along with earning All-Region accolades in basketball.

DOESN'T GET ANY EASIER

Playing in the Southeastern Conference, the Rebels are always going to play some of the top competition in the nation. And with a demanding non-conference slate, this season is no different.

There are currently 10 opponents that are either ranked in the Top 25 or receiving votes in one of the two major softball polls.

Those opponents include No. 2 Tennessee, No. 4

Texas, No. 7 Alabama, No. 12 Georgia, No. 14 Louisiana-Lafayette, No. 17 Auburn and No. 19 LSU. Florida and Mississippi State are receiving votes in both polls, while Houston is receiving a vote in the ESPN.com/USA Softball poll.

HURLERS CHASING RECORDS

Junior LHP **Mary Jane Callahan** and senior RHP **Dana Brill** are approaching some of the Ole Miss career marks in several different categories.

Callahan has 23 career wins, which is one shy of Lindsay Price for third place on the all-time list, while Brill sits in fifth with 19 victories.

With 362 strikeouts, Callahan is just 12 shy of tying **Amanda Fine** for the most in Ole Miss history. Brill has 279 career K's, which is currently fourth-best in school history.

NEW FACES, NEW FACILITIES

Ole Miss Softball begins the 2006 season with a brand new coaching staff at the helm and some state-of-the-art new facilities in which to practice.

Missy Dickerson (UCLA, '92) takes over as the Rebels' head coach after a three-year stint at Texas A&M-Corpus Christi, during which she guided her team to the Big South Conference Championship and an NCAA Tournament berth all three seasons.

Tom McLaughlin and **McKewn Dannelly** enter as the assistant coaches. McLaughlin, the Rebels' pitching coach, arrived in Oxford after serving under Dickerson at TAMU-CC, where he coached Sarah Pauly to All-America status and three consecutive Big South Pitcher of the Year awards. Dannelly was an assistant at South Carolina-Upstate last year after six seasons with Coastal Carolina under his father, Jess Dannelly.

With a \$1.2 million renovation project, the Ole Miss Softball Complex is being transformed into one of the nation's elite facilities.

Highlighting the project is a brand new hitting/practice facility which makes Ole Miss one of only a handful of programs in the country to boast a facility solely for the use of softball.

press box, refurbished dugouts, new video and audio systems, a brick facade lining the grandstands, new lighting and fixtures, new fencing and netting and a central seating section with comfort-designed chair-back seats.

REBELS LOADED WITH EXPERIENCE

This year, Ole Miss has the luxury of most of its players having seen plenty of game action in their careers. The team is made up of four seniors and six juniors to go with seven underclassmen.

The Rebels welcome back 12 letterwinners, including five position starters and all three pitchers, while losing just five letterwinners from last year's 30-28 squad. Junior **Mary Jane Callahan** was the top hitter and pitcher a year ago after batting .371 and recording a school-record 1.49 ERA.

REBELS LOOK TO BUILD ON 2005 W'S

Coming off a 30-28 season in 2005, which marked the first winning season in Rebel softball history, the team looks to continue its efforts at becoming a factor in the SEC.

Missy Dickerson and her new coaching staff are building a foundation for success. All three coaches have experienced some highly successful stints in their careers, including Dickerson being a starting infielder at UCLA when they won back-to-back-to-back national championships.

But it doesn't hurt that the Rebels have some veteran players who helped the team post some big wins a year ago. **Ole Miss beat No. 4 UCLA 3-2 in 14 innings last year**, thanks in large part to a 15-strikeout performance by returning pitcher **Mary Jane Callahan**.

The Rebels also recorded wins vs. No. 24 Southern Illinois, at No. 21 Texas A&M, at No. 25 Auburn and the program's first-ever win in Tuscaloosa over No. 11 Alabama.

GOOD WORKS

Mary Jane Callahan was Ole Miss' representative on the 2005 SEC Softball Good Works Team, being honored for her extensive work in the community. She was an integral part of the North Mississippi Regional Center's Halloween Carnival and the Oxford Boys and Girls Club. She was a member of the Big Brother/Big Sister program, helping to mentor children in the Oxford area. A native of Muenster, Texas, she has spent time volunteering for the "Reading with the Rebels" program, stressing the importance of reading to elementary students. Callahan also participated in the canned food drive for the Oxford Food Pantry.

SUCCESS IN THE CLASSROOM

Ole Miss had several players honored for their academic efforts in the 2004-05 school year. **Mary Jane Callahan**, **Jordan Chitwood**, **Stacy McCommon** and **Mandy Ott** were recognized as members of the 2005 SEC Academic Honor Roll, while **Kayla Mosley** was named to the SEC Freshman Academic Honor Roll. Ott was named to the UM Chancellor's Honor Roll after a perfect 4.0 GPA in

2004-05, while Mosley made the Chancellor's list in the fall. McCommon made the UMAA Honor Roll both semesters, while Chitwood, **Erin Faircloth** and **Brittany Warner** made the UMAA Honor Roll in the fall, and **Dana Brill** and **DeDe Justice** made the list in the spring.
