

SCOUTING THE FLAMES

After a momentous road win at Georgia Tech, UIC has dropped its last two, including a 75-74 loss to crosstown rival Chicago State last time out. The Flames are returning eight letterwinners and three starters from last year's 15-14 squad that ended the program's streak of three straight postseason berths. A reserve a year ago, senior forward Justin Bowen has led the offensive charge thus far this season, averaging 15.9 points, 8.3 rebounds and 1.7 steals while shooting 59.0 percent from the floor. Sophomore JUCO transfer forward Othyus Jeffers is posting 11.9 points and 7.0 boards. That duo has helped the Flames enjoy an advantage on the boards of nearly 10 rebounds per game. In his 10th campaign as UIC head coach, Jimmy Collins is the team's winningest head coach with 146 victories and has guided the Flames to four postseason appearances, including three NCAA Tournaments (1998, 2002 and 2004).

OLE MISS-UIC SERIES

Saturday's game will mark the first encounter between the Rebels and Flames.

CHICAGO REBELS

Four members of the Ole Miss family call the Windy City home — sophomore center **Dwayne Curtis**, freshman center **Marquis Young**, sophomore guard **Justin Cerasoli** and assistant coach **Tracy Dildy**. Curtis and Young will be suiting up as a collegian for the first time in their hometown. Cerasoli is sitting out this season after transferring from Seton Hall and is not making the trip with the Rebels.

DILDY'S RETURN

Rebel assistant **Tracy Dildy** will not only be returning to his hometown of Chicago this weekend but his alma mater. Dildy was a two-year letterwinner (1989-90) for UIC, where the point guard still ranks

D.C. PRESIDES OVER REBEL CHARGE

After foul trouble handcuffed him in his first two games in a Rebel uniform, **Dwayne Curtis** has taken charge for Ole Miss in the last three outings. The 6-foot-8, 290-pound center has shot 68.0 percent (17-of-25) and averaged 16.3 points and 10.0 rebounds in the last three games. Curtis posted double-doubles in two of the contests, tallying 10 points and 12 boards against Louisiana-Monroe last time out and coming up with 18 points and 12 rebounds against South Carolina State. The Chicago native lit up Centenary for 21 points, 6 rebounds, 6 assists, 3 blocks and 3 steals. Curtis has taken over the team-lead in scoring (10.8), rebounding (7.6) and assists (14). His 1.63 assist/turnover ratio is also best on the squad.

SEC Throwback Weekend

DE-FENSE, DE-FENSE

Throughout his Rebel tenure, defense has become a trademark of **Rod Barnes'** squads, and that was certainly evident in the win over Louisiana Monroe. Ole Miss limited the Bulldogs to 43 points, making the second time this season and 29th instance in Barnes' eight years at the helm that the opposition was contained below 50. The Rebels also held ULM to 31.1 percent shooting and 1-of-19 from 3-point range. Ole Miss held its opponent in the 30s in shooting percentage seven times last season.

The Rebels currently rank fourth in the SEC in scoring defense (62.8) and third in 3-point percentage defense (.325). Ole Miss is also forcing 18.0 turnovers per game, fourth-most in the league. The Rebels forced S.C. State into 25 turnovers and Centenary into 23. Ole Miss forced 12 opponents into 18 or more turnovers last year.

BULKING UP

The new big bodies in the Rebel lineup have paid some dividends in the early season. After being out-rebounded a year ago, Ole Miss currently boasts a 3.8 advantage on the boards, fifth-best in the SEC. The Rebels are also averaging 5.0 blocked shots per game, a considerable increase from last year's 2.0 average.

MISCELLANEOUS

The Rebels are off to a 4-1 start for the first time since 2002-03 ... Junior guard **Bam Doyne** has recorded new career highs in each of the last two games, following up his 12-point performance against Centenary with a 16-point outing vs. Louisiana Monroe. Doyne leads the Rebels in steals this season with 8 ... Sophomore center **Dwayne Curtis** ranks 10th in the SEC in rebounding (7.8), and junior guard **Todd Abernethy** is ninth in 3-point percentage (.458).

CHARITABLE STRIPE

The Rebels are off to a productive start to the season from the free throw line, connecting on 69-of-102 for a 67.6 percentage, which ranks fourth in the conference. That figure is an 6.7 percent upgrade from last year's team percentage of 60.9. Sophomore **Jermey Parnell** shot 45.2 percent a year ago but is an improved 11-for-12 so far this year. **Bam Doyne** has been good on 12-of-17 from the stripe, while **Londrick Nolen** is 7-of-10.

"O"-RRIVAL

The Ole Miss offense has shown some major signs of improvement at the season's start. The Rebels are currently averaging 69.6 points per game, which is 5.8 higher than last year's team scoring clip and would be the highest since posting 72.0 in 2001-02. Ole Miss is also shooting 19 percentage points higher from 3-point range at .382 percent. The Rebels topped the 100-point plateau against Centenary, 107-67, for the first time since a 105-71 victory over Alabama in 2001 and only the second time since 1998.

TOUGH ON NON-CONFERENCE FOES

Since the 1993-94 season, the Rebels have posted an 116-39 record (.748 winning percentage) versus non-conference opponents. Non-conference foes have found Ole Miss especially tough under head coach **Rod Barnes** (1998-99 through 2005-06), as the Rebels have an impressive 81-22 mark (.786 winning percentage) against out-of-conference teams. Ole Miss has been dominant against non-SEC clubs at home. Last December's loss to Florida State was only the Rebels' fourth non-conference home loss since 1995.

REBELS VS. THE HORIZON LEAGUE

The Rebels have an all-time record of 2-0 versus current members of the The Horizon League. Those two lone matchups occurred in the 1970s, with the Rebels knocking off Wisconsin-Green Bay 83-53 in Oxford and Loyola Chicago 83-75 at an Illinois State tournament in Normal, Ill. STRONG STARTER

Against Southern Utah, **Todd Abernethy** continued his outstanding play in season openers with a team-high 16 points with 6 rebounds. The junior guard also topped the team in scoring in last year's season opener against South Carolina State, dropping in a career-high 18 points with 5 rebounds and 4 assists. In addition, Abernethy began his career with a 9-point, 6-assist effort against Arkansas State in the 2003-04 season opener.

REBELS INK TWO FOR 2006-07

Ole Miss strengthened both its frontcourt and backcourt in November, receiving national letters of intent from **Solomon Bozeman**, a 6-foot-1, 165-pound guard, and **Herbert Terry**, a 6-foot-7, 215-pound forward. Bozeman and Terry will attend Ole Miss beginning in the 2006-07 academic year.

The son of former Rebel assistant coach Eric Bozeman, Solomon was the *Oxford Eagle* Player of the Year in 2005, when he scored 25.1 points per game as a junior at Oxford High School. Bozeman also averaged 6.6 assists, 4.9 rebounds and 1.9 steals per game while shooting 53 percent from the field and 39 percent from three-point range. Bozeman will finish his prep career this season at Magnolia High School in Magnolia, Ark., where his father is the head coach at Southern Arkansas. Eric Bozeman accepted the head position at SAU after seven years on Barnes' Ole Miss staff.

A native of Indianapolis, Terry averaged 14 points and 13 rebounds a game last year for Southport High School, where he also earned state track honors in the high jump. He transferred from Southport to Southside

High School in Fort Wayne, Ind., for his senior season. Terry played summer ball with Fort Wayne-based Blessed IJN and dropped in over 30 points a game with 14 boards at the prestigious Hoosier Shootout in July.

Also new to the Rebel lineup in 2006-07 will be **Justin Cerasoli**, who transferred to Ole Miss from Seton Hall in July. The 6-foot-5, 180-pound guard is practicing with the team this fall but is ineligible for the 2005-06 season by NCAA transfer rules. Cerasoli may begin playing in the 2006-07 campaign with three years of eligibility remaining

Curtis redshirted last season and practiced with the Rebels after transferring from Auburn in May 2004. As a freshman with the Tigers, he played in 19 games with five starts and averaged 2.9 points and 2.3 rebounds in 10.3 minutes per game. The Chicago, Ill., native shot 58 percent from the field.

NEW BEGINNINGS FOR REBELS

Ole Miss adds seven new faces in 2005-06 to a Rebel squad that returns six letterwinners. The lone starter among that group is senior forward **Londrick Nolen**, who finished first on the team in blocks (0.6) last season, tied for first in rebounding (4.4), second in scoring (9.8) and third in steals (0.9).

After earning SEC Sixth Man of the Year honors a year ago, junior guard **Todd Abernethy** returns to the starting lineup this season. The Carmel, Ind., native boasts career averages of 6.9 points and 2.7 assists with a 2.2/1 assist/turnover ratio.

Sophomore center **Dwayne Curtis** will see his first action with the Rebels this year after transferring from Auburn, where he played in 19 games starting five for the Tigers in 2003-04. Also joining the Rebels is an incoming class that was ranked as high as third in the nation by recruiting publications.

OLE MISS FACES STRONG SLATE

With 10 opponents that advanced to 2005 post-season play, Ole Miss faces another challenging basketball schedule in 2005-06. The slate boasts 17 home games and 10 matchups set for TV.

The non-conference slate is highlighted by home encounters with Memphis, Saint Louis and two-time Southland Conference champion Southeastern Louisiana.

The Rebels are beginning SEC play on the road for the seventh time in Barnes' eight years at the helm, and will start the conference schedule against Alabama for the first time since the 1977-78 season. Ole Miss faces each Western Division opponent (Alabama, Arkansas, Auburn, LSU and Mississippi State) twice on a home-and-home basis.

Ole Miss hosts SEC Eastern Division foes South Carolina, Florida and Vanderbilt, and travel to Georgia, Tennessee and Kentucky. The SEC Tournament returns to Nashville's Gaylord Entertainment Center.

"TAD PAD" SWEET "TAD PAD"

The "Tad Pad" has proven to be one of the toughest arenas in the nation for opposing teams to play. Ole Miss has won 114 of its last 140 games (.814 winning percentage) at home, including homecourt winning streaks of 29, 20 and 15 games. The Rebels have an all-time record of 356-173 (.673 winning percentage) at Tad Smith Coliseum, which opened in the 1965-66 season.

In head coach **Rod Barnes'** era, the Rebels have a home record of 86-25 (.775 winning percentage), including a 35-21 homecourt record against SEC foes (.625 winning percentage). The following shows Ole Miss' home overall and league records under Barnes:

OXFORD, Miss. (AP) - Bam Doyne scored a career-high 16 points to lead Ole Miss in a 59-43 win over Louisiana-Monroe.

Ole Miss (4-1) won its third consecutive game as Dwayne Curtis scored 10 points and 12 rebounds. Jermeay Parnell added 10 points for the Rebels, who improved to 51-4 against non-conference opponents at home since 1998.

The Rebels led by as many as 27 points in the second half, despite shooting only 16-of-47, 34 percent. Doyne was 4-of-8 from the field and added five rebounds, three assists and a pair of steals in a complete performance.

Louisiana-Monroe (3-4) was led by Adrian Harper, with 13 points and a game-high 13 rebounds. Tony Hooper added 10 points for the Indians who were 19-of-61 from the field, but only 1-of-19 from three-point range.

Ole Miss led 31-12 at halftime after building an insurmountable 22-4 lead in the opening minutes. The Rebels hit five three-point shots in opening surge, including a pair by Todd Abernethy and Doyne.

The Rebels have not lost to Louisiana-Monroe over the past eight seasons with an average margin of victory of 20 points.
