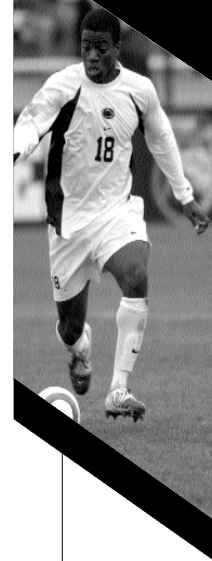


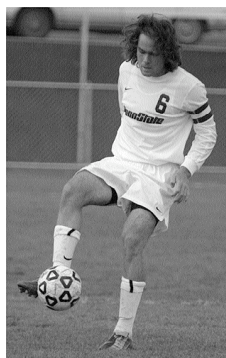

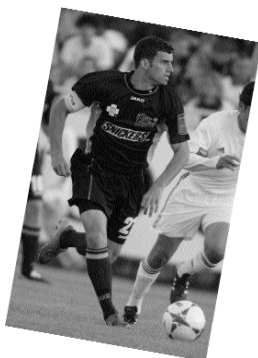

2004 SEASON IN REVIEW

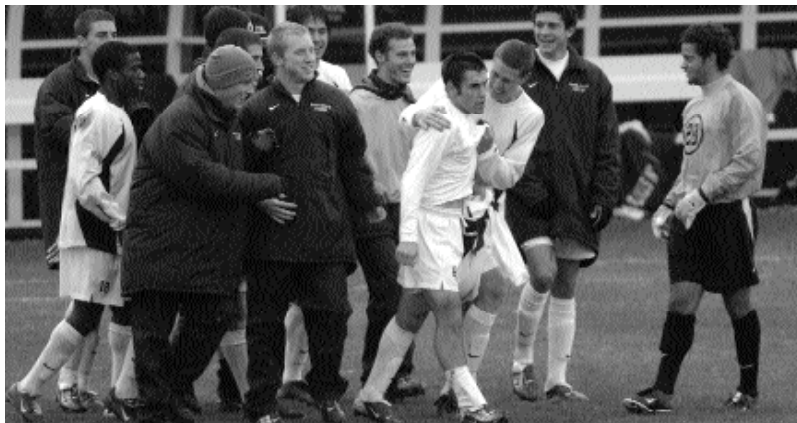
THE SEASON: The Nittany Lions compiled a 10-4-8 overall record, including a 9-0-6 record against non-conference opponents. Penn State struggled in Big Ten games (1-3-2) and bowed out of the Big Ten Championships after one game. However, Penn State was rewarded for a very demanding schedule by receiving its first-ever seeding in the NCAA Tournament, with a No. 10 seed and a first-round bye. No. 25 Tulsa came to Happy Valley, and made up for an earlier loss to the Nittany Lions by prevailing on penalty kicks. Senior Chad Severs capped a brilliant career by leading Penn State with 9 goals and 21 points. Freshman goalkeeper Conrad Taylor played every minute in net, recording eight shutouts, and Richard Costanzo (4-7-15) was named the Big Ten Freshman of the Year.

NEW JEFFREY FIELD: Jeffrey Field received a make-over prior to the 2004 season. The old turf and stands were torn down, and then replaced to add drainage with a new field surface, and an extra 1,500 seats to bring the seating capacity to 5,000. The stands were nearly filled with an announced crowd of 4,583 when No. 6 Indiana came to town on Oct. 1.

DEFENSIVE STAND: Freshman goalkeeper Conrad Taylor played every minute between the posts. He was named Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week a remarkable five times.

BIG TEN HONORS: Seven Penn State men's soccer players were honored by the Big Ten Conference for outstanding seasons in 2004. Richard Costanzo became the fourth Nittany Lion to pick up the Big Ten's Freshman of the Year award, joining Stuart Reid (1992), Rich Wilmot (1993) and Chad Severs (2001) as previous honorees. Midfielder David Walters was named to the all-Big Ten First Team, giving Penn State at least one First Team honoree for every season it has been in the conference. Forward Chad Severs and midfielder Brian Devlin were both named to the all-Big Ten Second Team, while Costanzo, Stephen Reihner and Conrad Taylor were all named to the all-Freshman Team, and Grady Renfrow picked up the Big Ten Sportsmanship Award.

FABULOUS FRESHMAN: While Costanzo and Taylor picked up Big Ten honors on the all-Freshman team, those weren't the only awards they picked up. Taylor was named to the Top Drawer Soccer all-Freshman First Team, while Costanzo was named to the second team. The two freshmen received the same honors on the College Soccer News all-Freshman teams, and both were named Soccer America Freshman All-Americans.

A GOOD BACK LINE: The Nittany Lions allowed just three goals over their final eight games. That included five shutouts, including four straight, by Conrad Taylor.

FEELING A DRAFT: Senior co-captain Gabe Bernstein was hampered by nagging injuries most of the 2004 season. But that didn't stop the Cleveland Force from drafting him in the fourth round (27th overall) of the Major Indoor Soccer League College Draft.

WORKING OVERTIME: Penn State set an unofficial NCAA record by playing in 13 overtime games in 2004. Eleven of those games went into double overtime, which is also an unofficial NCAA record. The Nittany Lions compiled an overtime record of 4-1-8.

NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS: Penn State finished the non-conference portion of its schedule with a 9-0-6 record, including a tie in its NCAA match against Tulsa. The Golden Hurricane advanced on penalty kicks in that game. It marked the first time since 1999 (12-0-1) that the Nittany Lions finished unbeaten in non-conference tilts.

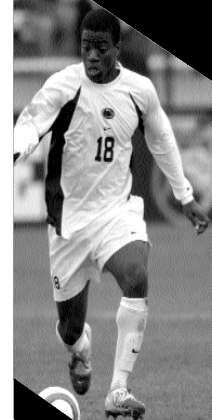
BALANCING ACT: The Nittany Lions had 15 different players score goals in 2004 after just 11 players found the net in 2003. Twenty of the 21 players who saw action for Penn State recorded at least one point. The only player not to record a point was Gabe Bernstein, who played in just six games because of injury.

SAD TO SEE YOU GO: Chad Severs wrapped up a brilliant career by leading Penn State with 9 goals and 21 points. He finished his career ninth on Penn State's all-time scoring list with 90 points. He is also ninth in all-time goals with 38.

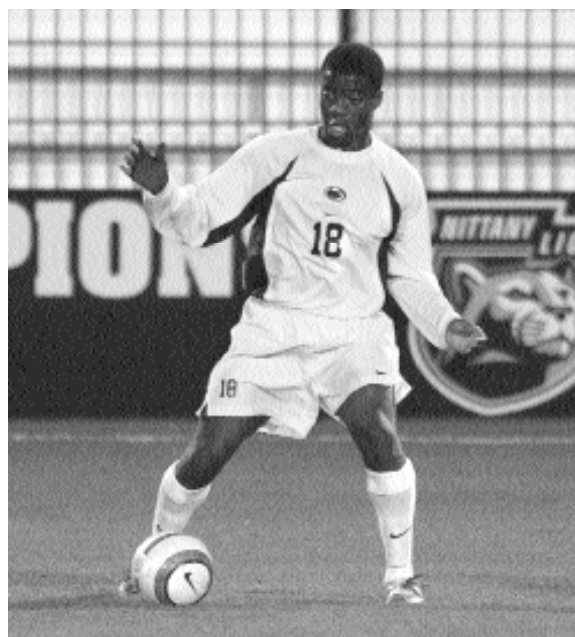
