The field house is also the base of operation for the overall Rock athletic program.

DIRECTIONS TO THE ROCK AND MORROW FIELD HOUSE

From I- 79, take Exit 105 (Slippery Rock). Turn left at the stop sign at the end of the exit ramp and follow State Route 108 north into Slippery Rock. At the traffic light, turn right onto Main Street. Follow Main Street to the second traffic light (Kiester Road). Turn left onto Kiester Road and proceed to the flashing light. Turn left onto the SRU campus. At the dead end, turn left to go to Morrow Field House or turn right to go to Visitors parking areas in the West Lake or East Lake parking areas. **Please note:** Parking adjacent to Morrow Field House is reserved for SRU staff during school hours but is available to the general public after 5 p.m. on weekdays and throughout the weekend.

Andy Waeger joins The Rock head coaching ranks for his second winter after serving as SRU's graduate assistant just two years ago.

At the age of 25, Coach Waeger is one of, if not the, youngest head coaches in the nation.

In his former capacity as graduate assistant, Coach Waeger worked primarily with the stroke and distance training groups.

Coach Waeger was also the recruiting coordinator and, as such, brought in a talented group of freshmen for the 2003-04 season.

Prior to coming to The Rock, Coach Waeger was the assistant coach at Fairmont State (W.Va.) College in 2001-02. While there, he helped coach swimmers to third- and fourth-place finishes in the 100- and 200-backstroke events at the NCAA Division II national meet.

Coach Waeger is a Level 3: NCAA II certified coach by the American Swimming Coaches Association.

During the summer of 2000, Coach Waeger worked as a counselor/coach at the University of Texas' Longhorn Swim Camp, where he worked alongside world-class coaches and athletes.

Coach Waeger served as the head coach of the Dublin Dolphins swimming team during the summers of 2002 and 2003 and led his team to the NEW League

championship each summer.

He has also held the position of head coach for the Fairmont Aquatic Club, Fairmont Area Swim Team and the Bridgeport Swim Team. He also spent two summers as an assistant coach of the Dublin Dolphins.

Coach Waeger was a four-year letterwinner at Fairmont State College and served as team captain in his senior season.

During his final collegiate campaign, he was the Bluegrass Mountain/West Virginia Intercollegiate Athletic Conference champion in the 200 breaststroke, as well as being a member of the winning 400 medley relay. For his efforts, he was named to the 2001 All-WVIAC team.

Coach Waeger is also a two-time West Virginia state champion and former record-holder in the 100 breaststroke. He was also part of the FSC Feaster Center record-setting 200 medley relay team.

Coach Waeger completed work on his master's degree in sport management at SRU in the summer of 2004.

He graduated from Fairmont State with a bachelor's degree in secondary education in 2002 and holds certification in Ohio and West Virginia.

Coach Waeger is a 1997 graduate of Coffman High School in Dublin, Ohio.

Alan D. Reynolds Memorial Scholarship

Tony Mehalic, a two-time All-Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference selection, was the 2002-03 recipient of the Alan D. Reynolds Memorial Scholarship.

The Reynolds Scholarship was created in 1985, shortly after the death of Reynolds.

Reynolds was an outstanding student-athlete at what was then Slippery Rock State Teachers College from 1947-51.

"Alan had a great love from Slippery Rock University and an innate desire to help the people who were most in need," Earl Birdy, a member of the Class of 1951 and a former teammate and roommate of Reynolds, said at the time the scholarship was originated. "The establishment of an endowed scholarship in his name will enable his memory and ideals to become an integral part of the future of Slippery Rock University."

The Reynolds Scholarship is awarded annually in the amount of \$500 to a male or female swimming student-athlete who shows financial need and excels in the classroom.

The initial scholarship was awarded in 1987 to Laurie Lafferty, a two-time All-American at The Rock.

The scholarship is administered by the Slippery Rock University Foundation, Inc., through the SRU University Advancement Office.

Bob Murray Endowed Scholarship

Tony Mehalic was the first-ever recipient of the Bob Murray Endowed Scholarship, which was awarded for the first time in the fall of 2002 to an SRU swimming student-athlete.

Mehalic also received the scholarship for the 2003-04 season.

The scholarship was created by and is named in honor of Dr. Robert Murray, a former Rock swimming student-athlete.

He was a tri-captain and one of the top freestyle sprinters on the 1970-71 Rock team, the final one coached by Jim Egli.

Dr. Murray earned a Bachelor of Science in Education degree from Slippery Rock in 1971 and was awarded a Master's degree in education from the school in 1974. He later earned a Ph.D. from Ohio State University.

Dr. Murray is now Director of the Gatorade Sports Science Institute of the Quaker Oats Company.

The Murray Scholarship will be awarded annually in the amount of \$1,000 to a deserving swimmer. A preference is given to a candidate who majors in exercise science.

The scholarship is administered by the Slippery Rock University Foundation, Inc., through the SRU University Advancement Office.

The scholarship award winner will be determined by The Rock's head swimming coach, in conjunction with the director of athletics, chairperson of the exercise science program and a representative of the SRU Financial Aid Office.

The scholarship will be renewed as long as the student-athlete remains on the team, meets NCAA eligibility requirements and continues progress toward a degree.

Did you know ...

Bob Ogoreuc, who retired from coaching at the end of the 2002-03 season, was the third Rock swim coach to record 100 or more career victories.

Ogoreuc ended his career with 101 in 12 seasons as the head men's coach and women's coach. **Jim Egli** is The Rock's all-time winning coach with 107 victories in 14 seasons as men's coach, while **Pat Madden** recorded 101 wins in eight seasons as women's coach and five seasons as men's coach.

Rock Swimming Tradition

The heritage of swimming as an integral part of the successful athletic program at Slippery Rock University dates back over 70 years.

Rock swimmers hope to continue this tradition of success under 1st-year men's and women's head coach **Andy Waeger**, who takes over for **Bob Ogoreuc**.

During his tenure, Ogoreuc coached seven swimmers who earned a combined total of 21 All-American honors and eight swimmers who claimed a total of 10 PSAC championships.

In the last six seasons alone, Rock swimmers have earned a total of 33 All-PSAC honors. The men's team finished in the top 25 nationally on three different occasions under Ogoreuc's guidance.

Three unbeaten seasons

Ogoreuc led three Rock teams (1996-97 and 1998-99) men and 2001-02 women) to unbeaten dual-meet seasons. He is the only SRU swim coach to have had an unbeaten season.

In 1997, Ogoreuc was named PSAC men's "Coach of the Year" after leading The Rock to a second-place finish at the conference meet.

The Rock has also hosted the national championships, most recently the 2000 NCAA D-II Men's and Women's Swimming and Diving Championships in Buffalo, N.Y.

The Rock's success in swimming is not just a recent occurrence.

Ogoreuc followed a line of great coaches.

The roots of The Rock men's swimming program can be traced back to 1933-34. Early records are sketchy, but the early years were reportedly highlighted by a perfect 8-0 record achieved in 1936-37.

The man who is known as "the father of SRU men's swimming" is **Jim Egli**, who compiled a 107-57 record in 14 seasons (1956-57

through 1970-71) as The Rock's coach. His squads won four Penn-Ohio championships, one PSAC title and earned eight PSAC runner-up honors during

the conference's early years.

Egli coached The Rock's first national champion, **Bill McGinnis**, who won the NAIA 50-yard freestyle in 1958-59.

The second winningest coach in Rock swimming history, SRU alumnus **Pat Madden** was one of the top coaches in the nation even before accepting the SRU job. He

recorded 646 wins in 25 seasons of high school, university and club coaching. He compiled a career record of 100-45 in eight years as The Rock women's coach and five seasons as the

men's coach.

Ogoreuc became the the third Rock coach to win 100 dual-meets joining Egli and Madden as Rock coaches with 100 or more victories.

Madden, a former All-American swimmer at The Rock who later became the mayor of the Slippery Rock borough, he produced more than a dozen All-Americans during his coaching career.

Madden, who qualified for the 1960 U.S. Olympic Trials, also made his mark as master's swimmer in his later years.

In terms of longevity, **Bill Hotchkiss** set the pace. He was The Rock men's coach for 15 seasons (1971-72 through 1986-87). Under his guidance, Rock swimmers earned more than 20 All-American honors. Among his products were NCAA Division III national champions **Bruce Seaman** (100 freestyle) and **Mark Seybert** (3-meter diving).

Women's history

The women's program began in 1964 under coach **Wilma Cavill**. She remained at the helm through 1976 and was

responsible for the program growing into a conference and national title contender.

Dick Hunkler succeeded Cavill as the women's coach. Under his tutelage from 1975-83, more than 100 Rock women gained All-America recognition and the program made the successful transition from EAIWA to NCAA Division III competition.

Madden succeeded Hunkler as women's coach in 1983-84.

For the previous 17 seasons, The Rock men's and women's teams had a common coach.

Madden coached both the men's and women's teams for

five seasons; Ogoreuc was at the helm of both programs for the last 12 seasons prior to this year.

Top talent

McGinnis, Seaman and Seybert remain the only Rock

swimmers to win national titles.

Egli, Madden, McGinnis and Seaman are members of the SRU Athletic Hall of Fame. Joining them in that elite group are **Pat Campbell, Corrie Convis, Tom Erdos, Lynn Comer Kachmarik** and former coach **Wally Rose**.

Convis is generally recognized as SRU's top female athlete of the 1980s. She earned 12 All-America awards and has SRU records that still stand today.

Campbell and Erdos were top swimmers for the early Rock men's teams.

In recent history, both **Scott Hendry**, an eight-time All-American and three-time PSAC champion, and **Ryan Phillips**, a PSAC Rookie of the Year, made a splash on the national scene.

On the international level, **Sherri Scobie-Henry** competed in the 2000 Olympic Games in Sydney, Australia, while Hendry swam in the 1996 British Olympic Trials.

Hendry and Phillips were part of a PSAC-champion 200 medley relay team in 1997.



Home meets in Morrow Field House pool

The Morrow Field House pool, dedicated in 1963, is the home of The Rock swimming and water polo programs and serves as a focal point for numerous activities and events in the Slippery Rock area.

Once considered one of the top facilities in the East, time has taken its toll on this excellent facility. But, thanks in part to a major renovation at the conclusion of the 1991-92 season, the pool continues to turn out not only top-flight aquatic competitors but also literally hundreds of highly sought after water specialists in various fields.

The 16-hour per day schedules at the pool includes, in addition to athletic team practices, physical education class instruction and recreational use.

The Rock's aquatic program,

which is coordinated by head water polo coach Jim Yeamans, also benefits from the presence of the pool at the Robert N. Aebersold Student Recreation Center, which opened its doors in 2000.

Turn left onto Keister Road and proceed to the flashing light. Turn left onto the SRU campus, proceed to the "T" in the road, turn left and follow the road to Morrow Field House.

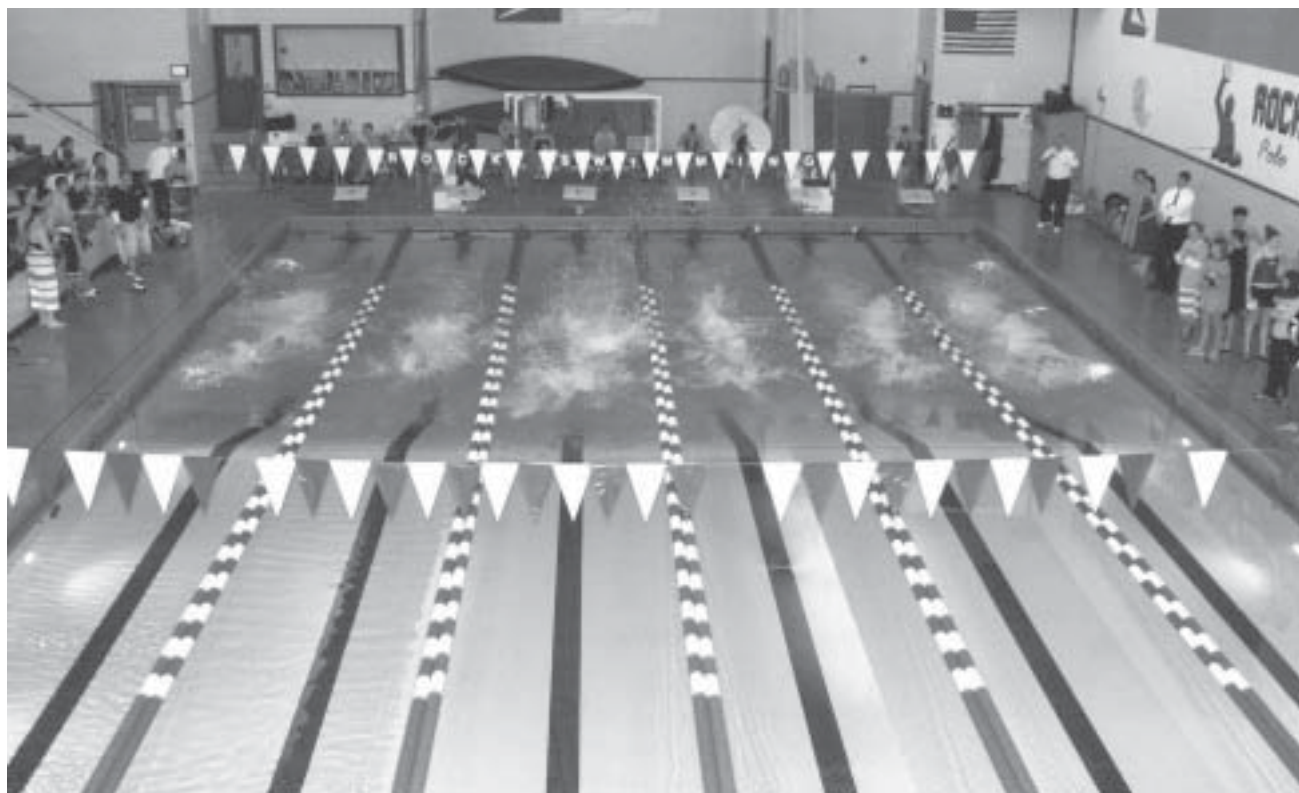

The Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference, with 52 years of organized competition, has established itself as one of the most respected National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Division II athletic conferences.

In its history the PSAC has laid claim to 33 NCAA team champions and 186 individual title winners, giving credence to its fine athletic tradition. The conference's prosperity on the national level was abundant again in 2002-03, as nearly one-third of the league's 245 teams participated in NCAA postseason competition. The PSAC also distinguishes itself as the second largest Division II conference in terms of sports sponsorship, awarding titles for 22 different sports.

Academic success is paramount for PSAC member institutions as well. During the 2002-03 academic year, 1,200 student-athletes were designated by the conference as "Scholar-Athletes" after attaining a cumulative grade point average of 3.25 or better.

Additionally, 11 PSAC student-athletes earned Verizon/CoSIDA (College Sports Information Directors of America) Academic All-America Awards last season.

and administering men's athletic programs within the 14 state teachers colleges in Pennsylvania. In 1977, due to the growth of women's athletics, the conference was restructured to provide for women's programs.

From its inception, each conference member selected its own competitive division within the NCAA. In 1980, however, the presidents voted to reclassify the entire conference to Division II. Although all 14 institutions are members of NCAA Division II, nine schools have also elected to

One of the largest conferences in the nation, the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference is governed by the presidents of the 14 member institutions. It employs a commissioner, assistant commissioner for media relations and secretary at its headquarters in Lock Haven, Pa.

Morrow Field House

Morrow Field House, the home of The Rock athletic department and site of home volleyball games, is named in honor of Dr. James Morrow, to whom goes the credit for organizing and starting what is now Slippery Rock University.

Dr. Morrow was hired in 1889 as the first principal of Slippery Rock State Normal School. Prior to assuming that position, Dr. Morrow was a grade-school principal on Pittsburgh's north side, a licensed lawyer and attained the rank of captain in Company F of the First Virginia Volunteer Infantry during the Civil War.

Dr. Morrow received his Bachelor of Arts, Master of Arts and Doctor of Philosophy degrees from Washington & Jefferson University.

Morrow Field House, in addition to being the home court of The Rock volleyball team, hosts home competitions for SRU's men's and women's basketball, men's wrestling, men's and women's swimming, men's and women's water polo, and men's and



women's indoor track and field teams. The facility also serves as the site various team practice sessions when inclement weather conditions force teams to move indoors.

The Rock's athletic and physical education department offices are

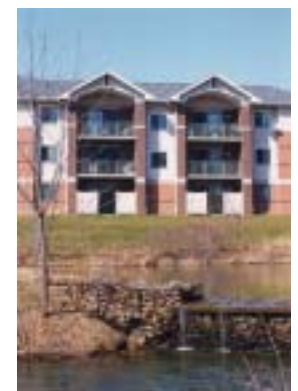
also housed in the Field House, which took on a relatively new look thanks to an extensive renovation project that was started during the 2000-01 academic year and completed during the 2001-02 academic year.
